1. Call to Order.

Chair Daggett called the meeting to order at 6:03 PM.

Chair Barbara Barwise called the Budget Board Meeting to order.

The Budget Board voted unanimously to approve the Budget Board Minutes for March 5, 2020.

2. Joint meeting with Budget Board for remaining fiscal year 2021 department operation budgets.

Fire Chief Jay Everett, Public Works Director Mike Claus, Public Health Nurse Allison Kenneway, Director of Parks and Recreation Carol Cook, Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation Breese Reagle, and Treasurer Jen Lord all presented the remaining operational budgets.

3. Approve the February 27, 2020, and March 5, 2020, selectmen meeting minutes.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to approve the February 27, 2020, selectmen meeting minutes. **Vote**: 4-0.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to approve the March 5, 2020, selectmen meeting minutes. **Vote**: 4-0.

4. Public Forum (This is an opportunity for anyone who wants to address the Board of Selectmen with any issue that is not on the agenda.).

There were no comments.

5. Consider a renewal liquor license application submitted by W & A, Inc., DBA Cape Pier Chowder House, 79 Pier Road.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to approve the Cape Pier Chowder house renewal liquor license application. **Vote**: 3-01/Selectman Daggett recused himself.

6. Consider request for funding for the multi-town substance abuse initiative.

Chief Robert Mackenzie from Kennebunk Police Department said putting people in jail is not working to stop substance abuse. He would like to work with other communities to be proactive and identify the problems with children early before they start abusing drugs. He requested a \$500 contribution for this initiative. He has received contributions from Kennebunk Savings Bank, Town of Kennebunk, Rotary District 7780 Recovery initiative, and others are pending.

Larry McCullough, executive director of Pinetree Institute in Eliot, said he has studied the effects of adverse childhood experiences in relation to substance abuse. The donations will help facilitate meetings with other communities so they can identify the issues and work on prevention.

Motion by Selectman Matthews-Bull, seconded by Selectman Briggs, to approve \$500 contribution taken from the contingency fund to the substance abuse initiative. **Vote**: 4-0.

7. Authorize a Quit Claim Deed for map 5, block 1, lot 7.

9. Endorse a commitment letter to Maine DOT for Small Harbor Improvement Program Grant.

Town Manager Laurie Smith said she needs Board approval to send a commitment letter to Maine DOT to apply for a Small Harbor Improvement Program Grant since they don't have all of the money in the reserve account for the 50-50 match when the match is due.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to endorse a commitment letter to Maine DOT for a Small Harbor Improvement Program Grant and authorize the Town Manager to apply for the SHIP Program. **Vote**: 4-0.

10. Accept \$200 donation from the United Way of York County for the emergency fuel fund.

12. Other Business.

Ms. Smith passed around a policy authorizing the establishment of a temporary COVID-19 Leave Bank for employees who are exposed to the virus or are a caretaker to someone with the virus so that they will not be charged sick leave or vacation time for the 14 day time period. All other illnesses would be covered under the sick-time policy. She said they are making sure that employees are self-reporting if they have symptoms of COVID-19 as identified by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) or if they have engaged in, or plan on engaging in activities that increase the likelihood of exposure to the coronavirus.

Motion by Selectman Hutchins, seconded by Selectman Matthews-Bull, to establish a COVID-19 Leave Bank for employees for 14 days. **Vote**: 4-0.

Ms. Smith announced the school will be closing the school facilities to outside departments including the Parks and Recreation Department.

The Board recommends that as a safety measure, the Town cancel all nonessential committee meetings until further notice. This suspension applies to the following committees:

§653. Hearings; bureau review; appeal

1. Hearings. The municipal officers or, in the case of unincorporated places, the county commissioners of the county in which the unincorporated place is located, may hold a public hearing for the consideration of applications for new onpremises licenses and applications for transfer of location of existing on-premises licenses. The municipal officers or county commissioners may hold a public hearing for the consideration of requests for renewal of licenses, except that when an applicant has held a license for the prior 5 years and a complaint has not been filed against the applicant within that time, the applicant may request a waiver of the hearing.

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§653. Hearings; bureau review; appeal

1. Hearings. The municipal officers or, in the case of unincorporated places, the county commissioners of the county in which the unincorporated place is located, may hold a public hearing for the consideration of applications for new on-premises licenses and applications for transfer of location of existing on-premises licenses. The municipal officers or county commissioners may hold a public hearing for the consideration of requests for renewal of licenses, except that when an applicant has held a license for the prior 5 years and a complaint has not been filed against the applicant within that time, the applicant may request a waiver of the hearing.

- F. A determination by the municipal officers or county commissioners that the purpose of the application is to circumvent the provisions of section 601; and
- **G.**After September 1, 2010, server training, in a program certified by the bureau and required by local ordinance, has not been completed by individuals who serve alcoholic beverages.
- 3. Appeal to bureau. Any applicant aggrieved by the decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners under this section may appeal to the bureau within 15 days of the receipt of the written decision of the municipal officers or county commissioners. The bureau shall hold a public hearing in the city, town or unincorporated place where the premises are situated. In acting on such an appeal, the bureau may consider all licensure requirements and findings referred to in subsection 2.

B. If the decision appealed from is an application denial, the bureau may issue the license only if it finds by clear and convincing evidence that the decision was without justifiable cause.

5. Appeal to District Court. Any person or governmental entity aggrieved by a bureau decision under this section may appeal the decision to the District Court within 30 days of receipt of the written decision of the bureau.

An applicant who files an appeal or who has an appeal pending shall pay the annual license fee the applicant would otherwise pay. Upon resolution of the appeal, if an applicant's license renewal is denied, the bureau shall refund the applicant the prorated amount of the unused license fee.

Section IV: Terms and Conditions of Licensure as an Establishment that sells liquor for on-premises consumption in Maine


