


# Comparison with 2010, 2015 data

    - Doesn't count residents who moved to assisted living, etc.






• Are you able to shovel your walks?





• Of those who do not drive and are driven by family or spouse/partner





• How many drive at night without qualification?







• How many times a week do you go out?




 How many times a week does someone come to visit?






• All age groups showed active volunteers; most active were baby boomers 65-74






How often do you use the internet during the week?








• Which best describes your fridge and pantry?





There are already plenty of resources: COS, food banks, ride shares, fuel assistance, church outreach, town health department, etc. Most of the elderly that I know in this town are financially stable (or better in most cases), own multiple homes, or own homes in KPT that are well above 500K in value, vacation abroad extensively or winter elsewhere. There may be a few native old salts, but they are surely the exception, and many of these have been here for generations and have family nearby.

Rather than focus on a non-issue, the community leaders and those who have the time and inclination to be involved should focus on recruiting younger people as full time residents to Kennebunkport. I have heard an argument that the cost of housing is prohibitive to young families. But I would argue that there are plenty of 2 income professional young families that would be thrilled to live in this community with our excellent schools, plenty of extracurricular activities for kids, safety, natural beauty and natural resources, and could afford it.

#### What is Working for You or Not? Housing (continued)

We need to market to these younger families, not to tourists and retirees. I thank that if
 the community ever agreed to affordable housing, less well-heeled retirees and investors
 would snap it up, instead of younger aged families doing so. Kennebunkport is where
 retired people come to die.

It's a marketing problem and it's a matter of what is important to the leaders of this community, in particular the select board which is heavily weighted by very elderly individuals and those that benefit directly from the tourist industry. Old folks and tourists seem to be their main concern. This town will die, if it doesn't change. Look at poor Cape Porpoise, it is a caricature of its real and former self. RIP.
