What's in Your Well Water?

Does your home use well water? Looking to test your water this year?

To assist you the Kennebunkport Public Health Office will have free Water Testing Kits from Nelson Analytical Lab in Kennebunk available during the month of May for pick up on the porch at the office. (101A Main St. Kennebunkport)

Then on June 5, 2021 drop off your completed kit between 9-11 AM at the Village Fire Station on North St, Kennebunkport. The results will be emailed to you once completed.

Please be aware while the kits free, the tests do have an associated cost. Price list is inside kit, costs range from \$50-\$125 depending on type

of water testing you request.

Test options include: Standard Water Test, Standard with Arsenic Test, Comprehensive water test, and Comprehensive with Radon Water Test.



Are You Aware? KEMS Subscription Service

Are you someone who is managing medical costs? Since 2018, the Kennebunkport Emergency Management Services (KEMS) subscription program has helped reduced out-of-pocket costs in the event of a medical emergency requiring emergency

medical transportation to a local hospital. Both permanent and seasonal residents in the KEMS service area are eligible for this program.

KEMS is again offering this program for the calendar year 2021-2022.

The average cost of an ambulance transport is \$1,800. Annual KEMS subscription membership covers medical procedures, medicines and mileage required during emergency transport. The benefit of being a KEMS subscriber

Are You Aware? KEMS Subscription Service

is that KEMS will waive the remaining balance for the KEMS charged portion of your medical costs if your insurance does not cover all of the transport fees. While KEMS is a 911 emergency response organization and transports anyone in need of emergency medical services, insurance often does not cover the full cost of your ambulance transport. If there is a balance on your ambulance bill after KEMS receives the insurance reimbursement, active participants in the subscription program will

have their remaining balance waived, covering the remaining billable ambulance portion that is normally the patient's responsibility, offering you a tremendous savings.

Subscription Levels

Permanent Resident Individual Membership: \$150.00 dollars. Covers only the individual listed as a current subscriber.

Permanent Resident
Family of Two
Membership: \$300.00
dollars. Covers the
individual and
spouse/partner in the
household listed as
current subscribers.

Permanent Resident
Family Membership:
\$400.00 dollars. Covers
ALL permanent residents
of the home listed as
current subscribers.

Seasonal Resident
Membership: \$100.00
dollars. Covers each
individual of the home
that has paid the
\$100.00/person fee.

The KEMS subscription does not apply in the event that a neighboring EMS responds mutual aid to a subscriber's address.
