Treatment provided usually includes nail filing, trimming nails, reducing thick nails if needed, callouses/corn reduced or removed.


Cost is \$35, payable in cash or check to the Town of Kennebunkport.

### It's Rodeo Time! Join in the Fun!!


Join in the bike safety fun on July 16, 2022, from 10 AM-Noon in the parking lot behind Consolidated School, 25 School St., Kennebunkport.

Participate in a FREE Bike Safety Rodeo, designed to teach and encourage youth ages 3-12 years to ride bikes safely.




- Helmet check

# Rides for Neighbors, By Neighbors

The Kennector will provide an affordable transportation option for older people and adults with vision impairments or other disabilities, though as the program grows, it will be available to any adult over the age of 18, living in Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Arundel.

Using fully trained and vetted volunteer drivers, *The Kennector* will

initially provide rides for any purpose within a 15mile radius of Kennebunk (from York to Sanford to Biddeford), to those who sign up to become a member of this program and pay a nominal fee for each ride. (\$2 base fee, plus \$0.50/mile with a \$5 minimum.)

This program is built on a classic neighbor-helpingneighbor model, powered by the kindness and generosity that exists in communities like ours. At the heart of this program are volunteer drivers who sign up to be available when it is convenient for them to drive a neighbor where they need to go.

This service will be available M-F, excluding Town Hall closures.


