“Located sixteen miles east-southeast of Alfred, twenty-five miles from Portland. Formerly known as Arundel. Visited during the summer as early as 1602 by fishermen. First permanent settlement made by Richard Vines in 1629. Brought under the control of Massachusetts and incorporated in 1653. Placed under the jurisdiction of Saco for a short time in 1688. Re-incorporated under the name of Arundel in 1717. Name changed February 19, 1821.”



To: Jamie Mitchell, Constable of the Town of Kennebunkport, in the County of York, State of Maine.

GREETINGS:

You are hereby required in the name of the State of Maine to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Kennebunkport in said County of the Town Meeting described in this warrant.

To the voters of Kennebunkport: You are hereby notified that the Annual Town Meeting of this municipality will be held at Village Fire Station, located at 32 North Street, in said Town on Tuesday, the eighth (8th) day of June A.D. 2021, at 8:00 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of acting on Articles numbered one (1) and one a (1a) as set out below. The polls for voting on Article 1 shall be opened immediately after the election of the Moderator at 8:00 a.m. on June 8, 2021, and shall close at 8:00 p.m. While the polls are open, the Registrar of Voters will hold office hours to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote, to accept new enrollments, and to make any necessary corrections or changes to any names or addresses on the voting list. The continuation of said meeting will be held in the gymnasium of the Consolidated School building in said Town on Saturday, the twelfth (12th) day of June A.D. 2021, at 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon for the purpose of acting on Articles numbered 2 through 14 as set out below.

ARTICLE 1a. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 1. To elect under the provisions of Title 30-A, M.R.S.A. Section 2528, the following Town Officers: two (2) Selectmen, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor, for a term of three years; one (1) Director of R.S.U. #21, for a term of three years; one (1) Trustee of Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Wells Water District, for a term of three years; and one (1) Beach Advisory Committee At-Large Member, for a term of three years; and to vote on the following referendum questions 1-3.

For each Question 1 through 3, a certified copy of the proposed ordinance is on file in the Town Clerk's Office and is incorporated by reference into each Question.

QUESTION 1

AMENDMENT TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL ORDINANCE

Shall an ordinance entitled "June, 2021 Amendment to the Animal Control Ordinance" be enacted?

[Note of explanation: This amendment adjusts the times dogs may be present on the beach, and when a leash must be utilized in an effort to maintain the federal protection of the piping plovers and their known habitat on Goose Rocks Beach.]

QUESTION 2

SHORT TERM RENTAL ORDINANCE

Shall an ordinance entitled “An Act to establish a Short-Term Rental Ordinance” be enacted?

[Note of explanation: This article would create an ordinance that will require disclosure and licensing of residential short-term rentals operating within the Town of Kennebunkport and require them to meet certain performance standards.]

QUESTION 3

AMENDMENT TO THE LAND USE ORDINANCE

Shall an ordinance entitled “June, 2021 Amendment to the Kennebunkport Land Use Ordinance Concerning Residential Mixed Use Structures be enacted?

[Note of explanation: This amendment would add residential mixed use as a conditional use to the Dock Square Zone, increase the number of residential units from two to four, and allow the use to occur in multiple structures.]

QUESTION 4

AMENDMENT TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

Shall an ordinance entitled “June 2021 Amendment to the Administrative Code be enacted?

[Note of explanation: This amendment would remove the usage of an Assessors’ Agent and authorize the Town to appoint a position of Assessor, along with all duties currently afforded the Board of Selectman in processing and approving requests for abatements, exemptions and the like.]

Article 2: To see if the Town will vote to approve the following:

- A. To authorize the Town Treasurer, with the advice and approval of the Municipal Officers on behalf of the Town to sell and dispose of Real Estate acquired by the Town for nonpayment of taxes thereon, and to execute quitclaim deeds on such terms as they deem advisable, and to authorize the Treasurer to discharge unmatured liens on payment of taxes, interest and costs.
- B. To authorize the Town Treasurer, with the advice and approval of the Municipal Officers on behalf of the Town, to waive the foreclosure of any tax lien mortgage by recording a waiver of foreclosure in the York County Registry of Deeds for any real estate title to which they deem not in the best financial interest of the Town to hold, said authorization to waive not to prevent the Town Treasurer, with the advice and approval of the Municipal Officers, from later foreclosing on said tax lien pursuant to law, as they deem advisable.
- C. To make all real and personal property taxes due and payable upon presentment of bills and to charge five percent (5.00%) per annum on the first half if unpaid after September 10, 2021 (or 45 days after the date of commitment if commitment is after July 28, 2021) and on the second half if unpaid after March 10, 2022.

- D. To set the interest rate to be paid by the town on abated taxes at four percent (4.00%) for the fiscal year 2022.
- E. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to enter into a standard agreement with taxpayers establishing a “tax club” payment plan for commercial and/or residential real estate property taxes. (*Explanation: This article allows the Town to establish a tax club for citizens, similar to a Christmas club. Citizens establish a payment plan so that they can make monthly payments throughout the year without risk of penalties or interest charges.*)

Selectmen recommend adoption of this article– Voted 4-0.

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to approve the following:

- A. To pay for tax abatements and applicable interest granted during the fiscal year of 2021/2022 from Overlay. (*Explanation: The Selectmen, as Assessors, are authorized to raise Overlay under Title 36 MRSA section 710 but require voter authorization to spend Overlay. Overlay cannot be more than 5% of the Tax Commitment.*)
- B. To authorize the Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend from the following categories of funds as provided by the State of Maine: Municipal Revenue Sharing, Educational Certification Block Grant, Educational Tax Relief Grant, Public Library State Aid, Urban Rural Road Initiative Program, Civil Emergency Funds, Snowmobile Registration Funds, Tree Growth Reimbursement, General Assistance Reimbursement, Veterans Exemption Reimbursement, Department of Economic & Community Development Grant Program, Maine Emergency Management Agency, Homestead Exemption Reimbursement, and all other state and federal grants and funds including, when necessary, the authority to sign grant contracts, documents or other paperwork?
- C. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to carry forward unencumbered surplus fund balances on June 30, 2021 for the purposes originally appropriated and to the extent they deem advisable, such determination to be made at a properly noticed meeting of the Board of Selectmen.

Selectmen recommend adoption of this article– Voted 4-0.

Budget Board recommends adoption of this article – Voted 11-0.

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to approve the following:

- A. To authorize the Tax Collector or Treasurer to accept prepayments of taxes not yet committed pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. § 506.
- B. To authorize the Selectmen to accept easement deeds on behalf of the Town granting the Town the right to plant and maintain certain trees on private property located within the Town.
- C. To authorize the Selectmen to accept unconditional and conditional gifts of money or property on behalf of the Town, other than gifts of sewer extensions, subject to ratification by the Town at an annual or special town meeting held within one year of the Selectmen’s acceptance, except that such ratification shall not be required for a donation of money to the Town to supplement a specific appropriation already made, to reduce the tax assessment, or to reduce the permanent debt.

Selectmen recommend adoption of this article– Voted 4-0.

Article 5: To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government Program expenses.

Amount requested: \$2,078,769.

Selectmen recommend adoption of this article– Voted 4-0.

Budget Board recommends adoption of this article – Voted 9-0-1.

FISCAL YEAR 2022 BUDGET OVERVIEW

Each budget year builds upon the work of the previous years and creates a foundation for the future. When preparing a town budget, one must keep in mind that towns have long histories, and should not only be concerned with how the funding will impact the town in the present but how this will affect future decisions. Unfortunately, one can only postpone the future for so long before it becomes the present. The budget before you is addressing what I, as the Town Manager, see are our most pressing issues, but it does not tackle all of them. The FY 22 budget is built in a manner that safeguards services that residents value while moving us forward in our planning and capital investment efforts. The budget season is most importantly an opportunity to engage in discussion and analysis about the priorities of our community. The budget I have presented is a balance between a responsible fiscal framework and moving the Town forward on a number of goals while maintaining a service level residents value.

The municipal budget has an estimated tax rate increase of \$0.28 for municipal operations. Municipal expenditures are \$10.37 million, up by \$820,211 or 8.5%. Operations are up \$522,733 or a 7.08% increase; whereas capital is increasing by \$301,886 or 25.22%, and debt service has decreased by \$4,408. Although the increase is higher than previous years, it is reflective of the impact of a 0% increase in FY 21.

Over the past seven years, staff have implemented restructuring measures to use our resources more efficiently. These have included sharing positions between departments, restructuring duties, the use of consultants and contracts, and regional approaches. This year, the budget contains a new full-time position in the Planning and Development department to focus on planning efforts and the administration of regulations.

The largest decreases in FY 22 revenues are the reduction in the use of fund balance, which equates to \$375,000, although additional revenue of \$514,182 leaves us with a positive balance of \$179,182, or a 5.49% increase. This contributes to an almost \$0.09 decrease to the tax rate.

Expenses:

The expense side of the budget is up \$820,211. There is a varied list of drivers throughout the budget.

The increases in Planning and Development budget are focused on the Town's future planning needs and administration of the new Short-Term Rental (STR) Ordinance. Software costs for tracking STR data amounts to an estimated \$50,000 annually. There is an additional \$119,000 in salary and benefits for a full-time planning/code position. The new staff will administer the STR ordinance as well as undertake planning efforts throughout town to include the climate master plan, implementation of the village parcel project, and support of the Growth Planning Committee and Planning Board.

The Police Department budget increase is comprised of changes in employee participation in health plans totaling \$32,749, the fulfillment of the vacant Sergeant position in FY 22, and the 911 dispatch contract with York Police Department for just over \$11,000. Police patrol staff changes in the past year resulted in the adjustment in the health insurance line item. The Sergeant position has remained vacant over the past year as part of the cost cutting measures in FY 21 to keep the tax rate flat. The dispatch contract is not new, but the funding in FY 21 was not necessary as we were ahead in payments.

The Solid Waste budget increase is due to the return of curbside recycling and associated processing and contamination fees. Although recycling was brought back in FY 21, it was only funded for six months. This increase allows for a full year of recycling.

Public Works' increase is the reclassification of 25% of the Wastewater Engineer's salary and benefits to the Public Works department as well as adjustments in employee participation in health benefits. This department also experienced a retirement in the past year which adjusted the health insurance premiums.

The Contingency account is where all salary increases reside in the FY 22 budget. The current union contract expires on June 30, 2021. The funding in these lines allow the Selectmen to negotiate a new contract and assign the funding to departments as needed.

The Capital accounts include funding for all infrastructure, building, and equipment projects throughout town. The 5-year Capital Improvement Plan details the items required to maintain a level of investment in town assets. The FY 22 budget invests in roads, sidewalks, vehicles, infrastructure, and planning.

Revenues:

FY 22 nonproperty tax revenues are projected to increase by \$179,182 or 5.49%. These types of revenues account for just over 17% of the total budget. The rest is accounted for in property taxes. In the State of Maine, local governments are dependent on property taxes to fund most local expenses, as the use of local option sales taxes, lodging taxes, etc. are not allowed under state law. Intergovernmental revenue (from the state or federal government), to fund roads, schools, or economic support are modest in Kennebunkport due to the size of our valuation and population.

Staff have reviewed all revenue accounts including, their historical performance as well as collections during the pandemic. The revenues have been adjusted to reflect our best estimates considering current economic activity, the proposed State budget, and behavior patterns during the pandemic. Although we have increased revenue numbers significantly from our conservative approach in FY 21 due to the onset of COVID-19, they are not at the level we would have experienced pre-pandemic.

One new revenue is the licensing fees from the proposed Short-Term Rental Ordinance, estimated at \$115,000. The revenues are projected to cover the costs of administration of the ordinance. This includes the technology costs to collect data and license electronically as well as staff time administering and enforcing the ordinance.

During the past five fiscal years, I have recommended a reduction in the use of the Undesignated Fund Balance to offset the tax rate. A Fund Balance contribution toward the budget is deemed “normal” in most circumstances; however, in practice it is counting on savings in the year ahead to balance the budget. I recommended that the Town reduce its reliance on the Fund Balance and over the past five years we have reduced the contribution by \$25,000 each year. This resulted moving from a \$300,000 transfer to \$200,000. In order to meet the budget goal of a flat tax rate in FY 21, the town authorized a \$600,000 Fund Balance contribution toward the budget. In balancing the need for prudent fiscal planning with a desire to lessen the impact on taxpayers, I have proposed a \$225,000 transfer for FY 22.

Our Fund Balance Policy requires us to maintain 18%, or a little over 2 months of expenditures available in our General Fund Balance. Each year, as part of the audit process, the Board of Selectmen take action to transfer any additional funds to our Capital Reserve Account. These funds are still available in an emergency; however, they are reserved for future capital projects. As COVID-19 impacted both expenditures and revenues in the last quarter of FY 20, the Selectmen were only able to transfer \$10,555 to the account, which currently has a balance of \$472,224. In FY 21, the capital transfer was originally proposed at \$325,000 as part of an aggressive capital plan. Unfortunately, with the onset of the pandemic the capital was reduced as part of the budget strategy, but the transfer remained the same to balance the tax rate. This year I am proposing a \$325,000 transfer to offset the \$301,000 increase in capital expenditures.

Debt Service:

The Debt Service account is seeing a slight decrease in FY 22 of \$4,408. The decrease is due to aging bond payments with declining interest payments. It is important to recognize that debt service is a part of our capital plan. In FY 2025, a balloon payment on the Village Parcel bond will be due. The debt was structured in this manner to allow the Town the most flexibility in bonding. The town has the option of rebonding that portion of the debt or paying a portion off early. The next debt retirement will be in 2024.

BOARD OF SELECTMEN REPORT

The Board of Selectmen began 2020 with only four members due to the resignation of Stuart Barwise in 2019. Mike Weston joined the Board in January and, with his previous service to the Town, was quickly up to speed on all current matters.

Through winter and spring, the newly formed Solid Waste Committee continued to develop a plan for bringing recycling back to Kennebunkport. An important piece of the implementation was education on contamination. Too many waste articles were winding up in the recycling bin that are not able to be recycled. This contamination could cause expensive penalties to the Town and ensuring a low to zero contamination rate was a vital part of their efforts. The Town approved the restart of recycling as part of the FY 21 budget and the Solid Waste Committee did a fabulous job of preparing the town for the restart of the popular program for January 2021.

The Board received heartbreaking news in April as we learned of the unexpected death of longtime Selectman Stuart Barwise. Stuart was a great asset to the community, serving in many capacities, including as a Selectmen. His eloquence, convivial spirit, love of community, and balanced judgement will be greatly missed. An outpouring of support from residents resulted in sizeable donations to the Stuart Barwise Recreation Scholarship fund. These dollars will support low-income youth in recreation programming. The Board of Selectmen also took action to dedicate the Town owned portion of Goose Rocks Beach in Stuart's name as it was his much beloved childhood home.

The Village Parcel Master Plan Committee finalized their report for the Board of Selectmen during the summer. They had several public input sessions and included a wide variety of residents with differing viewpoints throughout the process. The committee members were Connie Dykstra, Russ Grady, John Harcourt, Jamie Houtz, Tim Pattison, Mike Weston, Rebecca Young and Selectmen representatives – Allen Daggett and Sheila Matthews-Bull. The group worked with our consultants – Mitchell Associates, Camoin Associates, Principle Architects, and Gorrill Palmer. Over the year that the committee met, they held numerous public sessions with residents, committees, and community partners. Although the original plan was to develop a master plan for the parcel, the committee decided that the best name for the process was a “Vision for the Village Parcel”.

The committee outlined the next steps in the process to include:

- Refining the village parcel vision
 - ◊ Determine the right balance between conservation/open space and development
 - ◊ Establish appropriate phasing for development
 - ◊ Set realistic expectations regarding recouping investment funds vs. public interest
- Encouraging the community to enjoy the property
 - ◊ Now! – develop a trail
 - ◊ Clean up the mitigation and disturbance areas
 - ◊ Create educational ecological areas.
- Identify Advisors and Partners
 - ◊ Heritage Housing Trust for affordable housing
 - ◊ Conservation Trust is the development of natural areas
 - ◊ Contact private developers to seek informal input
- Formalize the Process for Moving the Village Parcel Forward
 - ◊ Determine role of committee in future
 - ◊ Engage the Comprehensive Planning Process
 - ◊ Evaluate the various zoning options available
 - ◊ Establish a plan to create a monitoring program or pulse checks to evaluate the process and use of the property

The Selectmen also authorized the Public Works Department to install a small parking area at North Street and the development of a trail so that people could enjoy the property immediately. Work on the property continued with the cleanup of deadwood and creating a more aesthetically please entrance. Work on the Village Parcel was curtailed by the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic which consumed much of the Town and country’s time during 2020.

As part of the Village Parcel planning process, one of the clear priorities we heard from residents was the need for affordable housing in order to maintain a year-round population. The newly formed Kennebunkport Heritage housing Trust successfully received approval from the Planning Board for their first neighborhood, Heritage Woods, located on Main Street. The six homes will be constructed in 2021 and will feature energy efficient one-story and two-story homes. Another affordable housing win was the announcement by Habitat for Humanity on the development of two homes in Cape Porpoise. The Selectmen waived building permit fees for these homes to assist in their development. Although much more work is needed, seven homes is a great start.

Much of 2020 was devoted to the Coronavirus -19 pandemic. The Town's operations quickly changed in March, following the lead of the State of Maine and the world. Actions, such as social distancing, quickly became part of our everyday life, as well as constant hygiene and the wearing of face masks. All boards moved to a virtual format on Zoom, parking was limited to avoid crowding, services moved to online formats, and capacity limits for offices, restaurants, and stores quickly became the norm. The Board was extremely proud of the way our residents, volunteers, businesses, and staff swiftly became familiar with the new protocols and led the way in our region to safe ways to conduct business. Our Public Health department took on the job of COVID testing for our community.

With the COVID vaccine now out in distribution we hope that better days are ahead. Regardless, we have learned, once again, that Kennebunkport will weather the storms ahead.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you in the Maine Legislature. I look forward to providing responsive constituent services, advocating for you in Augusta, and passing measures to improve the quality of our lives.

This new legislative session looks quite different from any other because of the continuing COVID-19 pandemic. We were sworn in at the Augusta Civic Center, and much of our early work has taken place remotely, with both legislators and the public participating via the internet.

We are continuing to do the work you elected us to do publicly and transparently. Sustainable Economic Growth - Healthy economies depend on a solid foundation of educated people with access to infrastructure and equal opportunity. I am working to address the impacts of climate change and maintain our coastal ecosystem and working waterfronts, to make sure all Maine people have access to high speed internet and green power, and to build equity into everything we do so all people are included and empowered to contribute to our communities.

Age-Friendly Communities - The pandemic has laid bare the challenges that we face in caring for our elders and our children. I am working with the Caucus on Aging efforts to increase and stabilize our long-term and home care workforce and with the Children's Caucus on expanding high-quality early childhood education opportunities.

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to reflect on 2020, an incredibly challenging year for Maine families, small businesses, and communities.

When the pandemic struck, our country faced the specter of an overwhelmed health care system and devastation to our small businesses and the millions of people they employ. I immediately worked with Republicans and Democrats to pass multiple laws allocating approximately \$3 trillion to respond to this public health and economic crisis, including more than \$8 billion directed to Maine to support testing, schools, the economy, and other purposes — that is nearly double Maine’s annual state budget.

I am especially proud of the bipartisan Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) I co-authored. This program has provided three out of four Maine small businesses with nearly \$2.3 billion in forgivable loans, which has helped sustain more than 250,000 Maine jobs. As one small business owner told me, the PPP provided “exactly what we needed at exactly the right time.” The PPP also allowed employers to maintain benefits, such as health care, during this challenging time. While the pandemic continues across Maine, our nation, and the world, I thank the first responders, health care professionals, teachers, grocery store employees, factory workers, farmers, truck drivers, postal employees, and so many others who continue to stay on the job during this difficult time. With the deployment of the first vaccines, better tests, and the incredible speed with which these life-saving responses were developed, I am hopeful we can emerge from this crisis in the next few months.

While providing relief to American families was my focus throughout 2020, other accomplishments include the passage of the Great American Outdoors Act, which provides full funding of the Land and Water Conservation Fund and addresses the maintenance backlog at our national parks, forests, and wildlife refuges. As Chairman of the Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee, in 2020 alone, I secured \$132 million to improve Maine’s roads, bridges, airports, buses, rail, ferries, and seaports. Finally, as Chairman of the Aging Committee, I led the reauthorization of the Older Americans Act, which funds programs that improve the well-being, independence, and health of our nation’s seniors and their caregivers, and I authored laws to reduce the cost of prescription drugs and protect individuals with Alzheimer’s disease.

As the end of 2020 is approaching, I have cast more than 7,535 votes, never having missed one. In the New Year, my focus remains to work with colleagues to find common ground on policies to help support the health and safety of Mainers and the safe, responsible opening of our communities. Dear Friends,

2020 was a year unlike any in our lifetimes. Our state and nation dealt with unprecedented challenges—the coronavirus pandemic, ensuing economic fallout, and a prolonged, heavily divisive campaign season each took a significant toll on all of us. The worst part? In order to protect each other, we had to face these challenges in isolation. But a new year represents new possibilities; a chance to take stock of what we're grateful for and focus on the opportunities in front of us. As we reflect back on 2020, we will remember heartbreak and loss—but we cannot forget the shining rays of hope that broke through the darkness, reminding us all that better days are ahead.

Throughout the pandemic, my top focus has been on bridging the partisan divide in Washington in order to deliver desperately-needed relief for Maine people. Joined by colleagues last March, we pushed for bipartisan negotiations to produce a strong bill that helped fellow Mainers, businesses, and institutions weather this storm. In the weeks and months after the *CARES Act* passed, our team stayed in close contact with people throughout the state to determine how we should adjust our response to best support our citizens. Unfortunately, the aid provided by the *CARES Act* lapsed without Congressional action, leaving too many families and businesses in limbo. I never stopped pushing for a bipartisan relief bill and, after extensive negotiations, we ended the year on a good note by breaking the gridlock and passing new relief legislation. This new bill isn't perfect; in fact, it should just be the start our renewed response. As we enter 2021 with a new administration and new Congress, we must fight for additional legislation to help restore stability to our working families and rebuild our economy and public health infrastructure.

In the midst of this crisis, Congress did manage to accomplish a few successes that will outlast this awful pandemic. Among these was the *Great American Outdoors Act*, a bipartisan bill which was enacted into law in August 2020 and will help address a \$12 billion backlog at our national parks so future generations of Americans can enjoy these beautiful lands and create lifelong memories. Also, as we learn more about the recent hacks of our nation's networks, there is help on the way: 27 of the cybersecurity recommendations made by the Cyberspace Solarium Commission—which I co-chair with Republican Congressman Mike Gallagher—made it into this year's defense bill. While there is no guarantee that these provisions would have prevented the massive hack, they will certainly improve our cyber defenses.

Despite the challenges, I'm hopeful for the future. Vaccines are being distributed across our state—starting with our healthcare heroes, who have sacrificed so much throughout this unprecedented catastrophe and deserve our eternal gratitude. If there can be a silver lining from these challenges of 2020, maybe it will be this: I hope that, in the not-so distant future, we will be able to come together physically and we will be reminded of our love for each other. We have differences, without a doubt. But as Maine people stepped up to support each other, we saw again and again that our differences pale in comparison to the values we share. We are one state, and one community—and there is nothing we cannot or will not do for each other. Mary and I wish you a happy and healthy 2021. We can't wait to see you soon.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

One year ago, the Town began 2020 much like other years in the midst of budget preparation. In February, I submitted a budget focused on the future, concentrating on the many capital projects and reserve accounts to position Kennebunkport for the next 25 years. After only two budget presentations, along with the rest of the world, Kennebunkport stopped its work on the future to deal with the very challenging present. The Coronavirus 19 soon was in the spotlight and every waking minute was spent learning about the virus, transmission, and how to safeguard our citizens and community. The budget was paused as we learned to zoom, social distance, mask up, and expand hygiene protocols. After some time, we virtually met again and through a hastened budget process, reduced expenditures and revenues in order to deal with economic uncertainty. The direction was to decrease revenue projections, lower budgetary expenses and increase the use of fund balance to have a flat tax rate for FY 21. All of this led to a net impact on the budget of \$1.1 million. This resulted in a 0% tax rate increase, which allowed us to lower potential tax burdens, but postponed future planning.

Last year's budget was originally focused on capital planning, including reserve funds for the Cape Porpoise pier, roads, sidewalks, vehicles, equipment, a new town hall and renovations to the Village Fire Station. We were also on the verge of finalizing our plan for the Village Parcel and were set to begin the implementation process. All that planning and visioning got turned on its head with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic. Planning and projects went on the back burner as we shifted gears to deal with more pressing issues. This included a freeze on spending, moving to on-line services, implementing virtual meetings, working remotely, expanded public health education, and a host of other activities I never imagined we would undertake. 2020 was an exhausting year for the town, its residents, and its employees. It was working seven days a week to keep the wheels on the bus, never mind driving the bus to any destination. Unfortunately, future planning, including the comprehensive plan, village parcel master plan, the valuation market analysis, and infrastructure design and bidding was put on pause as we weathered the storm of financial uncertainty.

With the approval of COVID-19 vaccines, there is hope on the horizon. People are looking forward to the summer of 2021 in the hopes that it will mean the ability to gather with loved ones, enjoy group events again, and the opportunity to travel. Only time will tell how quickly we can put the pandemic in the past, but we are optimistic. In the meantime, the Town continues to unpackage the shelved work from the past year and begin to build the foundation for the future.

One of our most pressing future concerns, is sea level rise. Climate change will impact Kennebunkport in many ways over the next century. It will force all communities to examine their resiliency and question their sustainability. Although the Town has been engaged in preserving our environment through water quality analysis, the preservation of important lands and view corridors, and the reestablishment of recycling and solid waste programs, we need to develop a climate change policy. In FY 20, we funded an intern to perform the initial greenhouse gas data gathering process and identify short and long-term goals for consideration by the Board of Selectmen.

Town staff then began conversations with other coastal communities in August of 2019 and the six-town cooperative with SMPDC (Southern Maine Planning and Development Commission) was adopted. Each municipality is funding an equal share of our new Southern Maine Regional Sustainability and Resilience Program assisting our communities in the progress of our climate change goals. Finally, in the fall of 2020, the Selectmen began considering climate change goals and adopted a set of objectives over seven topic areas. The goals cover climate and resilience, education and outreach, green economy, energy, land ecosystems, community forest management, and municipal operations. Although the goals are many and varied, they have been spread amongst a variety of departments and committees to enhance the town's efforts.


In December, the Town witnessed the retirement of two long serving employees, Parks and Recreation Director Carol Cook and Assistant to the Town Manager, Arlene McMurray. Carol had 39 years of service with the Town, with 20 of those in her position of Director. A few years ago, I noted that 25% of our employees would be 65 years or older within 5 years. That has rung true in recent history, as much like the rest of the state, Kennebunkport is challenged to find the next generation of workers to provide necessary services to our residents, businesses, and visitors. This past year proved to me once again the resilience of Maine's communities and people. Even though the challenges were unprecedented, our citizens and staff worked together to overcome the unimaginable. Hopefully, these trials came with opportunities as well. One of those was the strong bond the Town formed with our business community. The establishment of the Kennebunkport Promise was an occasion to lead the way in public health protocols among a wide variety of businesses from restaurants and hotels to professional offices. The Chamber of Commerce and Kennebunkport Business Association stayed in constant connection with town management to determine the best steps forward from Memorial Day through to Christmas Prelude. I cannot thank them enough for their leadership and strength during 2020. May we all keep these lessons learned in hand as we embark upon a brighter year ahead.

ASSESSING DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Town Assessor's Office and the role of a Tax Assessor is to ensure assessments are fair and equitable. The Board of Selectmen/Assessors and I are responsible for discovering and listing all taxable property, real and personal, within the Town of Kennebunkport for the purpose of taxation.

The 2020 assessed valuation of the Town was \$2,011,016,700. The mill rate remained at \$9.45 for the 2020-2021 tax year. The sum of \$19,020,273 was committed to the Tax Collector on July 23, 2020.



What can one say about the year 2020? It was a unique year, bringing many changes to both professional and personal lives. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Board of Selectmen/Assessors made the decision to suspend the 2020 Market Adjustment project. Despite early uncertainties of the pandemic, Kennebunkport continues to show a strong real estate market. Our assessed values versus sale prices were 97% in 2019, dropping to 90% in 2020. As the percentages continue to fall, the exemption amounts that offer tax relief to taxpayers, will also drop. As I expect this trend to continue through 2021, these numbers serve as a reminder that a market adjustment is needed to ensure equity and fairness in your taxable valuation. Exemptions available to residents; the Homestead Exemption, and Veterans/Veterans Widow Exemption. The forms, instructions and eligibility guidelines are available online. The deadline to apply is April 1st. I welcome residents/taxpayers to contact the Assessor's Office at 207-967-1603, with questions about property assessments and available exemptions.

In closing, I would like to thank the Town Manager, the office staff, the residents of the Town, and the Board of Assessors/Selectmen for their cooperation and support during the past year.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE REPORT

What an interesting year it has been! Despite the challenges that Covid-19 handed us, building activity in 2020 remained strong with \$36.8 million in reported construction activity. Our daily code enforcement activities include examining building plans, issuing permits, performing site inspections, meeting with property owners and their representatives on potential projects, responding to zoning complaints, and continued flood map reviews with property owners. Covid introduced to us the practice of offering virtual inspections, project consults and more. In addition to our regular duties, Code Enforcement was tasked with responding to and investigating Covid related business complaints. A huge thank you to all the businesses that participated in the Kennebunkport Promise initiative. Their forward thinking in creating robust policies and procedures minimized inadvertent issues and allowed them to do an incredible job keeping their staff and guests safe.


Your Code Enforcement boots on the ground team consists of Andrew Welch, who continues to bring an expert eye to all building projects, Greg Reid continues to work with us on a part time basis and helps to balance the workload to a more sustainable level. Lisa Harmon provides us with administrative support and keeps our schedules running smoothly.

The Year of the Pandemic

As one could only imagine, Emergency Management has been a huge part in all aspects of the COVID-19 pandemic. Early on, the nation enacted the COVID-19 response a national disaster. The town leadership quickly took action to secure much needed safety supplies for the fight against the virus. The purchasing of disinfecting equipment became a priority, and many hours were spent trying to creatively secure much needed items.

We need to be responsible to ourselves and our families in making efforts to plan for those times when disaster comes. The emergency management folks in town are working with federal partners in the COVID recovery effort. We are continuing to input data in hopes of receiving federal funds associated with the pandemic. We fight for every penny our community deserves with a loud voice and continued determination.

Many local agencies (non-profits) have been an active partner in serving our needy community members and for that I am grateful. They assisted in food assistance as well as gift cards to local restaurants to not only help the needy but also the business community that has suffered as well. If you know of someone that participates in these organizations, take a moment to thank them, safely!

Together we can come through this tragedy. Together we can make a brighter future. It still requires planning and preparation.

FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Kennebunkport Fire Department consists of over 70 volunteer members responding from the town's four fire stations: Cape Porpoise, Goose Rocks Beach, Kennebunkport Village, and Wildes District. We presently operate 12 pieces of fire apparatus, plus two Zodiac rescue boats for water rescue.

Kennebunkport's firefighters are men and women of all walks of life who are committed to the safety of our town. As a volunteer "call force," we are paid only for response to calls and training time. We respond to fires of all types, motor vehicle crashes, water rescue situations, hazardous materials incidents, missing person searches, and many other types of emergencies. During severe storms and other disaster situations, we stand by to assist the community in any way that may be needed. We routinely provide mutual aid assistance to the fire departments of Arundel, Biddeford, Kennebunk, and Wells; and they, in turn, assist us as may be needed.

Kennebunkport firefighters normally train regularly in most areas of our operations. Over 40 of us are trained and state-certified in structural firefighting at the Firefighter 1 or 2 levels. Many members have completed advanced training in HAZMAT Operations, automobile extrication, ice and water rescue, various other types of technical rescue, wildland firefighting, and many other specialized areas.

In 2020, the COVID pandemic forced a suspension of our active training program conducted with the departments in Arundel and Kennebunk due to social distancing requirements. However, three of our members, Jacquie Hurlburt, Ryan Upton and Lucas Brown were able to complete Firefighter 1 & 2 courses this year. In addition, during 2020, iPad tablets were placed in our primary apparatus, allowing for automatic mapping of emergency calls, the rapid location of fire hydrants and real-time vehicle location information.

Fire Chief, John Everett, is a veteran firefighter with over 30 years of service with the Portland Fire Department, retiring as Deputy Fire Chief. Chief Everett has brought a wealth of experience to our department, well beyond what we might normally encounter in our small town. 2020 brought new challenges due to the pandemic in helping our firefighters and the community stay safe.

We are continually seeking new members for the department. If you are interested in learning more about what we do and possibly becoming a member, please call the Fire Department business office at 967-2114 or ask any Kennebunkport Firefighter. CAPE PORPOISE PIER HARBORMASTER REPORT



Cape Porpoise and the surrounding waters had a busy year while hosting a bustling commercial fleet, and busy recreational boating season even with the pandemic looming large. Mooring renewals and Pier membership held relatively steady with most folks seemingly finding time to practice social distancing on the water.

Lots of small infrastructure and maintenance improvements were undertaken at the Cape Porpoise Pier to increase usability and safety, such as new line on the “fish hoist”, new hoist controls, and general maintenance to the facility.

Fuel sales were down from last year but only slightly, mostly owing to the uncertainty surrounding quarantine rules and the pandemic. As a reminder, gasoline and diesel are available during Summer months from 8 am to 4 pm, Tuesday through Saturday. It helps to call ahead either on VHF channel 16 or the Pier Manager’s office at 207-967-5040 for scheduling.

The Harbormaster’s boat served another season on the water and is currently winterized. It will receive fresh bottom paint and general maintenance before being commissioned for the season this spring. I hope to also name the vessel this year and am searching for a locally significant name to apply to the boat.

The commercial lobster industry had a good year with steady prices and good catches. Given the challenges of limited restaurant openings and processing facilities being under quarantine, the reliance on retail sales and local “boat to table” sales bolstered the market and kept the season economically viable.

Tuna landings were also steady and while the price was more stable and quota less volatile than previous years, buyers capped landings and restricted buying to established vessels due to market glut which was directly related to the pandemic.

I look forward to another positive and productive season for 2021 and encourage anyone with questions about moorings or the waters of Kennebunkport to be in touch either by phone, email or stop down to the pier to say hello.

Halloween Trail of Treats

2020 was, well, 2020; but we feel that we had a successful year despite the challenges faced. At the beginning of the pandemic, we had to drop face-to-face programming and offer options in a fully remote setting. During this stint we were able to offer Tai Chi, Chair Yoga, All Levels Yoga, and a children's program. When we were able to return to our physical location, we provided 506 homemade Meals to Go for our seniors!

In May, we mourned the passing of long time Selectman Stuart Barwise. Scholarship funds were collected in his honor, and \$4,400 was raised to help expand programming opportunities to underprivileged children of the community.

Unfortunately, due to the uncertainty inherent in 2020, we could not offer our traditional summer camp for the first time in recent history. Instead, we focused on providing a series of specialty camps. We hosted STEM Camps and Nature Camps for older and younger campers. In partnership with the Kennebunkport Conservation Trust, we provided the kids with educationally driven activities. Additionally, we were able to plan and execute a glorious Outdoor Adventure Camp (also known as EPIC), serving over 20 teens while visiting Maine's natural resources, building teamworking skills and developing leadership abilities. This summer, we were also able to host a drive-in concert series.

The Fall also saw changes in programming. Sadly, we had to cancel Fall sports. As a result, we had more time to focus our attention on special events. Knowing that neighborhoods would be challenged to offer a safe Trick-or-Treating experience this year, we, with the help of the Chamber of Commerce, planned a drive-through event called the Trail of Treats at the Kennebunkport Conservation Trust's Emmons Preserve. We were able to safely serve over 600 children candy at over 10 different stations. There are too many to list in this article, but a thank you to all the town departments, local businesses, and not-for-profits involved.

This year we also saw some major staffing changes. Carinne Osgood left her position in October and in late November we welcomed a new Programmer to the Rec Department, Hope Mowry. She received her bachelor's degree in Anthropology from Smith College and is currently finishing her Master's degree in Adult and Higher Education at USM. Hope is looking forward to getting to know the community better and helping to fulfill the motto, "Community Happens Here".

Additionally, after 39 years, Director Carol Cook punched in for the last time on December 23rd. During Carol's tenure, she oversaw a wide variety of expanses in recreational opportunities, coming both in the form of new park spaces and innovative activities. She is excited to relax, travel (when it is safe to do so) and spend time with her new grandson.

As the year wound down, we joined the Trail of Lights and decorated our department as a gingerbread house. The kids found joy in helping adorn the outside with gum drops and in crafting gingerbread people. With their help we raised \$515 for our scholarship fund. Thank you to Cape Arundel Inn and Resort for sponsoring us as their non-profit as well!

The most rewarding, yet challenging, program we offered this year has been our Child Care Program. After learning that RSU-21 would open in a hybrid format, where students would only attend school in person two days per week with the rest of their learning being done remotely, we were able to answer both the schools' as well as parents' calls for a safe environment for students to learn. Through adherence to CDC guidelines, we have been safely offering childcare to parents when their children are learning remotely. Beyond the typical childcare we offer in our after-school programs, this program has required active involvement in each student's learning, both with communicating with parents, teachers, and other stakeholders, as well as assisting in day-to-day learning.

As we begin the new year and look toward the horizon, we are hopeful to return to a time when we have kids on our fields playing various sports with classmates, and for the reappearance of Chalk the Port, Prelude, and other large scale community events. But in the meantime, we will stay committed to keeping the community healthy while delivering quality programs in a cautious manner.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Where does one start when trying to recap the year 2020? The year started like any other year: we worked on reports, analyzed budgets, watched the snow, and recharged for the coming year. Covid became real very quickly for us all, sadly tragically for many. Like you we reacted, scrambling for cleaning supplies and these things called PPE. Safety for our staff and the public was paramount. We vacated town hall quickly, pulling retired computers out of storage so staff could work from home while transitioning our day-to-day business into the virtual world. Zoom became our connection with each other. While town hall was empty, we took the opportunity to install an ERV (Energy Recovery Ventilator) into our HVAC system to ensure we had fresh air coming into our building while exhausting potentially sick air out.

As we came back in the challenges continued, how do we support our residents and our businesses? A forward-thinking group of business operators in partnership with the chamber of commerce and the town worked to create the Kennebunkport Promise, a combination of front-line policies and procedures connected with communicating to the world that Kennebunkport was doing its best to keep their customers and staff safe. Out of a tragic situation came hope and a community that pulled together. Sewing machines were dusted off and masks made, distilleries switched from making vodka to hand sanitizer, food and fuel assistance was made generously available. With the blessing of the selectmen, we facilitated temporary flexibility for our businesses with outdoor dining, additional signage, and sharing of resources.

Once we had adapted to the “new normal” we turned our attention to boards and committees. Thanks to incredible support from our TV/Tech team we all received a crash course in conducting committee business over Zoom. Once we had a few meetings under our belt the process normalized, and we were able to resume Planning Board, Growth Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals. Other professional organizations followed with me being able to continue to represent Kennebunkport as a member of the Executive Committee for Southern Maine Regional Planning and Development Commission as well as serving on the Board of Directors for the Maine Building Officials Inspectors Association.

Other notable town wide planning projects include:

- The Board of Selectmen have been facilitating a community discussion surrounding the regulating of Short Term Rentals. Short Term Rentals (STR's) are typically residential homes that are rented out for vacation purposes for 30 days or less at a time. It has been a robust discussion with strong opinions surrounding the proposed licensing ordinance that is being worked on.
- Work continues on the rewrite of the Comprehensive Plan with the Growth Planning Committee with an update to be presented to voters in 2022.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND NURSING SERVICE REPORT

The Kennebunkport Public Health Department is located at 101A Main Street, sharing the site with the Kennebunkport Police/Communications Departments. A nurse is in the office Monday-Friday, from 8:00-9:30 am or by appointment. Messages may be left on the nurses' answering machine by calling 967-4401. Any messages left after 4:00pm will be returned the following business day.

Residents are encouraged to visit the nurses during office hours for blood pressure readings, blood sugar evaluations, dressing changes, suture removal, treatments, and consultation. The office provides a variety of free resources and materials regarding disease prevention, health promotion/education, and community events.

2020 has been a challenging year as we found ourselves in a global pandemic. Corona virus, or COVID-19 swept through the world. Americans have had to re-think how we go about our everyday lives. Mask wearing, handwashing, sanitizing, quarantining and social distancing have become a way of life this year. Many have had to work remotely, school children attend remote school via computers, and first responders and health care workers carried on wearing PPE (personal protective equipment) during their daily lives. Doctors started making "virtual calls" to their patients at their homes rather than seeing them in person. Many people find themselves in financial turmoil. Food insecurity has been on the rise. Local businesses struggle to make ends meet. Many shutting down. Unemployment recorded all time high numbers of people looking for assistance.

This year, 2020, has been extraordinary. Kennebunkport Public Health adapted services for the pandemic. Patient visits were limited to those who needed an in person visit and kept to 15 minutes or less to prevent them from being a "close contact" as deemed by the Maine CDC. PPE was always worn. For many of our patients, we set up phone call check-ins instead of in person checks if the situation warranted. We limited our office hours to one person in the building at a time and all must wear a mask to enter the building. We became a COVID testing site after we obtained an Abbott ID now machine through grant funding. We became a testing resource for first responders in local municipalities, Kennebunkport town employees, businesses, and residents. Our mission was to provide testing help to keep businesses open, offices running, and residents self-aware.

As 2020 closes and a new year begins, we at the Kennebunkport Public Health office are looking ahead. We have adapted to the changing health environment and will continue to do so as needed. We will always put forth the best medical practices we can so that we can actively and consistently provide the best resources for our community within our mission.

The Public Health Department continues to actively promote programs that focus on improving the health and welfare of our community members. Our service provides skilled nursing care at the public health office as well as in residents' homes. Outside agencies assist our staff in providing occupational therapy, physical therapy, home IV therapies, and hospice care. These agencies are usually covered by Medicare and private insurances. The nurses made 855 home visits and 1204 health supervisory visits/calls in 2020. Residents made 596 office visits for treatment and consultations. We would like to remind residents that the Public Health Department has a free durable medical equipment loan closet. This closet is funded by the Health Council and private donations. Articles include wheelchairs, walkers, commodes, toilet seat risers, crutches, canes, and adaptive home equipment. Residents came by to borrow or return equipment to our medical loan closet 194 times in 2020. Stop by before you buy!

Seven Health Officer Complaints were filed and responded to by the Health Officer. The State of Maine legislature mandates that each Health Officer completes a six-hour certification program as well as recertification courses yearly. In the event of an infectious disease outbreak, the Health Officer is required to work closely with Maine Public Health to report, monitor, and follow up on treatment and precautions to prevent the spread of the illness in the community. The Health Officer is responsible for distributing to the community the most current information, regarding symptoms and treatment as well as the status of incident that adversely affect the public's health until there is no longer a danger to the community.

The General Assistance Program, as well as the social service programs for Kennebunkport residents and guests are run through the Public Health Department. The status of this function can be found in the General Assistance report.

The Public Health Department offers programs, clinics, educational classes to the community. The Public Health Department and Walgreens Pharmacy offered two very successful Flu clinics in October. We also assisted with one flu clinic for the RSU21 school district. Kennebunkport Public Health has collaborated with Graves Library, Kennebunkport Parks and Recreation and Southern Maine Agency on Aging to provide Senior enrichment and social gatherings for the community. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic all programs were put on hold from March on. We continued to host monthly blood drives through the American Red Cross as blood remains in high demand. Please visit the Town of Kennebunkport web page for upcoming events and activities offered.

On June 6th, the Public Health Department and Nelson Analytical Lab/Kennebunk sponsored our annual Well Water Testing Day. The Public Health Department continues to offer this yearly event. The kits are free and there is a reduced fee for testing for Kennebunkport residents. It is extremely important to have your well water tested every year for a dug well and every three years for an artesian well. There are over 1,000 households in Kennebunkport who rely on well water. And along with water goes sewer. The Public Health department must encourage all residents to take care of your septic tanks with routine maintenance.

Septic inspections, pumping septic system out every 3-5 years, and water conservation is suggested to maintain your system. Many issues can be prevented with routine maintenance. Visit the public health website for more information on septic care/education.

Residents are reminded not to discard unused prescription and over-the-counter medications in your household trash or sewer/septic systems. Please deposit your medications in the secured box located in the Police Department's lobby. Disposing medications in your septic or sewer system can adversely affect the systems efficiency as well as influence the status of our watersheds. Those who are using sharps such as syringes to treat Diabetes and various illnesses, please bring them to our office for disposal in our Hazardous Wastes container or follow these guidelines set by Maine Environmental Protection agency at www.maine.gov/dep/waste/biomedical/sharps.html. Kennebunkport Public Health and Police Department participated in the drug disposal project "take back your drugs" sponsored by the Maine Attorney General's Office this past June. Visit the public health website for more information on medication and hazardous waste disposal.

Kennebunkport participated with Maine Healthy Beach program again in 2020. Healthy Maine Beach volunteers were not utilized this year due to the pandemic. Water sampling was collected by the public health nurses and Maine Healthy Beach staff. Samples were collected at both Goose Rocks and Colony beach two times per week, from Memorial Day through Labor Day to monitor the water quality for bacteria. The EPA sets 104 bacteria in a teaspoon of water as the maximum limit for safe water contact. Please visit <http://www.maineoastdata.org/public/CurrentBeachStatus.aspx> (Maine Healthy Beaches) for beach status history along with current conditions of any coastal Maine beaches participating in this program. The Goose Rocks Beach watershed was also monitored throughout the spring, summer and fall. Data collected is to assist with determining bacteria sources for contamination. This was done in collaboration with the Town of Kennebunkport, Department of Environmental Protection and Environmental Protection Agency.

Kennebunkport Health Council is looking for new members. The Kennebunkport Health Council invites any resident of the Town who is interested in the health and social welfare of the community to join the volunteer board. Please contact the Public Health Department for more information. Our baby box program which was established through the Health Council this year was successful. We provided these baby boxes to 13 babies born to town residents in 2020.

We wish to extend our appreciation to all Town of Kennebunkport employees, members of the Kennebunkport Health Council, and to all who have assisted us in our efforts to maintain a healthy community. We also wish to thank all our community members who remembered our office with donations, we thank you for your support!

GENERAL ASSISTANCE REPORT

General Assistance

The General Assistance Program is mandated by the State of Maine legislature. All recipients are responsible for meeting their own basic needs by any means available before applying for General Assistance. All eligible recipients are required to perform workfare; a failure to do so or falsifying information on an application results in an automatic disqualification of benefits for 120 days in any Maine community or township.

Eighteen General Assistance applications were requested. Two applications were filed during July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020. One individual qualified for assistance by the State of Maine General Assistance Program. The number of actual applications filed does not reflect the residents who requested an application and a meeting to discuss the process. Often, they decided not to apply for this program mostly due to the budget review and accountability process. As Kennebunkport's GA Administrator, the focus continues to be assisting residents with finding resources that meet the escalating housing, food and heating costs. Kennebunkport General Assistance is audited yearly by the Department of Health and Human Services.

During the winter of 2019-2020 the Kennebunkport Emergency Fuel Program provided for 19 emergency fuel deliveries of 100 gallons and assisted with avoiding two CMP disconnects. This program is funded by donations. The Kennebunkport "general needs" account is also funded by donations. It allows us to help residents pay for basic needs if they don't qualify for General Assistance through the State of Maine. In 2020, we found ourselves living through a pandemic which has been a strain on many families financially. Food insecurities has been on the rise. Unemployment assistance requests have been on the rise. Business struggle to keep their doors open. The governor has placed us on civil state of emergency.

Residents are encouraged to apply for the State of Maine Refundable Property Tax Fairness Credit. Kennebunkport offers to Kennebunkport residents the Kennebunkport Property Tax and Rental Refund Program. Residents must qualify for the State of Maine Rebate Program first before applying for the town of Kennebunkport's Program.

The Affordable Care Act continues to enable many of our working residents to have medical coverage. York County is fortunate to have medical services that provides care for those without insurance. Payment options are negotiated upon visit. Nasson Health Care- York County Community Action, 15 Oak Street, Springvale ME 04073. Hours: Mon/Wed/ Thurs 8am-6pm, Tues 8am-7pm, Fri 8am-5pm. This facility does accept clients who have insurance, Maine Care or are uninsured.

Food Distribution

Being a pandemic year, Community Outreach Services (COS) stepped up to the plate and extended its food pantry services. Maine CDC guidelines were followed for all volunteers along with neighbors picking up food boxes to keep everyone safe. Face masks, sanitizing, and social distancing were maintained. COS also relocated from St. Martha's church to its permanent home at the former Teen Center at 19 Park street in Kennebunk. COS offered two drop-in pantries a week, Tuesday evening and Friday mornings. COS also opened up for neighbors in need to make appointments (online, or by phone) to pick up food at their convenience during the week. They also offered home delivery to those in need who were high risk for COVID-19. This past year the Community Outreach Services Program provided 95 food boxes, 44 of them are senior households over 60 years of age. Due to the pandemic, we have seen an increase in food insecurity and food requests. The voucher program has been discontinued by COS as they are now able to provide neighbors with fresh produce, meats, fish and dairy directly. To access this program, residents must contact COS online: www.coskennebunks.formstack.com/forms/gafoodpantry or call: 207-604-0445 or by calling the Public Health Department at 967-4401, Monday-Friday. This past summer the Church Community Outreach Service and Community Harvest volunteers provided a free summer lunch program for all children in our district upon request.

At this time, we would like to extend a special thank you to all who donate monetary donations, nonperishable food at the various collection sites, and to those who pick up the goods at grocery stores and bakeries and deliver them to our community food pantries, soup kitchens, and shelters. Thank you to the stockers of shelves, the packers of boxes, the drivers who deliver the food boxes to those in need, and to the "special needs" shoppers. Thank you to those who took time out of their busy holidays to shop, pack, and deliver holiday dinners.

Other assistance:

- Stuff the backpack project was supported by our generous community, purchasing 7 back packs and gift cards to staples for school supplies for our school children.
- Secret Santa provided Christmas gifts for 4 Kennebunkport children.
- 13 holiday meal baskets were delivered from Community Outreach services. Community Harvest provided hot holiday meals to the community upon request for Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- 5 seniors received special holiday gift bags from the Senior Elves at the Senior Center Lower Village.
- We still collect used cell phones for Shelter Alliance to assist Caring Unlimited. Please leave them at our door, and we will be sure to pass them along to the appropriate agency.
- Kennebunk Rotary's program "CS3" provides clothing for children in need going back to school. 6 children in our community received back to school clothing.

General Assistance Administrators

York County General Assistance Administrators continue to meet with various federal, state and private sector representatives to review methods of funding and alternative resources to meet community residents' basic needs. General Assistance Administrators are also required to attend Department of Human Service classes to keep current with new legislation.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPORT



Sidewalk repairs—Ocean Avenue

Winter 2020 came to an early end mid-February as the Highway crew only had one plowable storm after February 19th. This allowed our crew to accomplish tree limbing on Goose Rocks Road from Log Cain Road to Whitten Hill Road. While our tree work was limited to the opposite side of the road from power lines, we were able to remove hazardous limbs that posed a danger over the roadway. Our mild winter also allowed us to complete street sweeping and get a jump on street line and crosswalk painting.

The Highway crew was fortunate that we did not have any positive COVID-19 cases in 2020. The crew worked with police, fire, the town hall and the Town Nurse to keep the public and our facilities safe with sneeze barrier construction, mask distribution, barricade installation and public signage for COVID-19 precautions to reduce public crowding and reduce the risk of COVID-19 virus spread.

This spring KKWWD completed water main replacement work on Ocean Avenue between East Avenue and the River Club. The Town hired Shaw Brothers Construction to construct a new seawall on Ocean Avenue between the River Club and the Nonantum Hotel. New brick sidewalk was installed with the help of a contribution from Ocean Avenue neighbor, John Rinaldi. Pike Industries worked with the Town to reconstruct Ocean Avenue after sidewalk work was complete. I would like to thank our engineers at Woodard and Curran, Shaw Brothers Construction, KKWWD and Pike Industries for making the project a success during a difficult COVID-19 spring construction season.

The crew's summer project was the completion of Wildes District Road reconstruction with paved shoulders from Turbats Creek Road to Maine Street. The crew replaced all cross culverts and hand-built catch basins with new precast concrete catch basins. Pike Industries reclaimed and repaved the road. Slipform concrete curb was added on hills for stormwater control. We extended the at-grade sidewalk between South Street and the Tamaraks and installed paving, curbing and stormwater drainage on Maine Street. Our paving overlay program was deferred due to COVID-19 financial concerns.

Our Town Mechanic, Bob Pappas, retired in October. We will miss Bob's work maintaining the Town Fleet and ask that all who see him in Cape Porpoise or out on the water fishing near Goose Rocks Beach say hello. Before Bob retired, he and our summer parks worker, Kevin McDonnell, did a great job with parks grounds and flowers at Mills Road / Goose Rocks Beach entrances and Silas Perkins Park along with caring for flowers at the Dock Square Parking Lot and Cape Porpoise Pier. We continue to work with the Parks and Recreation Department to help maintain town parks and fields. In November, Public Works and Robert Zuke Builders cut and set the Dock Square Christmas Tree for the Kennebunkport's annual Prelude celebration. Thank you to Robert Zuke Builders, Mark Dufoe and Prelude Volunteers for all the work done preparing Dock Square and Cape Porpoise Square for the Tree lights and decorations during a no-crowds COVID-19 Prelude.

TOWN CLERK REPORT

The year 2020 saw many changes in the world, and our small town was no exception. As an office that transacts most of its business face-to-face with our customers, we had to adapt the way we provided services. And once we started to feel comfortable, we had to adapt again and again and again. With change comes uncertainty but also opportunities for growth. The Town Clerk's staff rose to the challenge as we modified our procedures and worked closely with our residents and other departments to provide the level of service that is expected while following protocols and guidelines put in place to keep everyone safe.

A huge thank you to our Public Works Department who installed the plexiglass for our counters. It is invaluable to have access to the talent of that crew. From elections set-up to workstation repair, they are always willing to give us a hand with a smile on their faces.

I must also thank my staff, Audrey Williamson, Rose Wills and Becky Nolette. They worked tirelessly this year to serve our residents through difficult and uncertain times. With a large influx of new year-round residents, the office was busier than ever.

The following is a brief summary of the 2020 town meetings and elections:

January 7, 2020 – Special Town Meeting

This was a special town meeting to elect one Selectman, Assessor and Overseer of the Poor to fill a vacancy left by Stuart Barwise who resigned in September 2019. An election was held in November 2019; however, the results were a tie. Therefore, this election was held to determine the winner. There were 593 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot. D. Michael Weston was elected.

March 3, 2020– Presidential Primary and Referendum Election

The State of Maine held its first Presidential Primary in over 20 years. What a busy day it was! There were 1,539 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot. The Republican party nominee was Donald J. Trump. The Democratic party nominee was Joseph R. Biden, Jr. There was also a special referendum question regarding a new law that removes religious and philosophical exemptions to requiring immunizations to attend schools and colleges. Voters in Kennebunkport overwhelmingly supported the new law requiring immunizations to attend schools and colleges.

March 3, 2020– Special Town Meeting

This was a special town meeting to approve a Land Use Amendment to allow the Planning Board and Board of Appeals to publish in a weekly newspaper as opposed to a daily newspaper and to post notices on the Town's website. There were 1,537 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot.

June 16, 2020– R.S.U. #21 District Budget Meeting

We vote on the school budget in a two-step process as required by the school consolidation law. The first step is to vote on the various segments of the budget at a district-wide meeting of Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Arundel voters. The meeting was held at Kennebunk Elementary School at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of approving the 2020/2021 school budget. The total budget proposed was \$51,570,853.

July 14, 2020–R.S.U. #21 Budget Validation

The second part of the school budget process is the Budget Validation election. Kennebunkport, Kennebunk and Arundel each held elections at our own town polling places to approve the budget that was adopted at the above district budget meeting. In Kennebunkport there were 1,260 ballots cast either in person or by absentee ballot. The budget passed in all three towns.

July 14, 2020–State Primary and Special Referendum Election

The State of Maine held a primary election for United States Senator, Representative to Congress, State Senator, Representative to the Legislature and the County seat of Register of Probate. There was also a Special Referendum with two bond questions. Both bond questions passed, and each party selected their nominees. There were 1,269 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot.

July 14, 2020 – Annual Town Meeting

As with the RSU #21 Budget Validation, the Annual Town Meeting was pushed back a month due to the pandemic. We also had to relocate the polling place to the Consolidated School gym in order to have more room for mandated social distancing. The first half of our Annual Town Meeting is a secret ballot vote to elect our Town officials and to vote on any referendum questions that the Selectmen propose. This year there was one Selectmen seat and one R.S.U. #21 Director seat open. Edward W. Hutchins, II, ran unopposed for the seat on the Board of Selectmen, with a term of three years. Louis Braxton, Jr. ran unopposed for the R.S.U. #21 Director's seat, with a term of three years. There were 1,256 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot.

July 18, 2020 – Continuation of Annual Town Meeting

On Saturday morning at 9:00 a.m. at Consolidated School, voters reconvened to vote on the 2020-2010 Town budget. All articles were approved as written in the Warrant.

November 3, 2020– Special Town Meeting

We were back to the North Street Fire Station for the November elections. We did have to re-arrange our polling place and used the fire truck bays to conduct voting instead of the usual meeting room (due to social distancing mandates). We welcomed a new Moderator, George Emery, to the team. There were three ordinance questions, all of which passed. There were 2,827 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot.

November 3, 2020 – State of Maine Presidential Referendum Election

Presential elections are typically busy from the time that the polls open until they close. This year, however, we had 68% of total votes cast through absentee ballot. Our small office was mainly focused on absentee voting from the end of September until election day. There were 2,827 votes cast either in person or by absentee ballot. Kennebunkport voters elected Joseph Biden (D) for President of the United States. Sarah Gideon (D) was chosen for U.S. Senator. Chellie Pingree (D) was chosen for Representative to Congress. Susan Deschambault (D) was chosen as State Senator. Traci Gere (D) was chosen for Representative to Legislature. Scott Houde (D) was elected as Judge of Probate-York County. Carol Lovejoy (R) was elected Register of Probate-York County.

We lost two valuable members of our election crew this year. Barbara Barwise, my Deputy Registrar, moved out of town in August to be closer to family and Wayne Adams, our long-time Moderator, passed away unexpectedly in July. They will both be missed for their talents as well as their big smiles. I must thank Claire Julian, who served as Warden for our elections. She worked tirelessly to meet the ever-changing requirements necessary for us to hold elections during the pandemic. Elections take so much preparation during normal times, but this year brought that to a new level. My ballot clerks deserve a special thank you. For so many of them, this was the first time they worked at the polls. They jumped in with enthusiasm and learned quickly what goes on behind the scenes on election day. They are loyal and dedicated citizens of the town and we owe them a debt of gratitude for their service on election days. Lastly, I want to thank David Powell and Marc Cote who provided the sound and video at our open town meeting. They also had to adjust the way they provided audio and video for town meeting due to COVID regulations. Their expertise is greatly appreciated.

And now the statistics for 2020... We issued 48 marriage licenses, 755 certified copies of vital records and 24 burial permits. There were 42 recorded deaths and 13 recorded births, of which there were 9 boys 4 girls. We issued 852 dog licenses, 26 annual and 4 daily liquor licenses, 21 special amusement permits, 62 victualers licenses, no special event permits, 8 non-resident recreational clam licenses, 75 resident recreational clam licenses, 2 trolley permits, 2 horse-drawn carriage permits and many hunting and fishing licenses. We also processed thousands of Dock Square Parking Lot Vouchers and hundreds of Goose Rocks Beach parking stickers. In addition, we also processed over 7,000 tax payments, registered thousands of cars as well as 299 boats, 60 snowmobiles and 49 ATVs, not to mention the constant stream of questions we answer and the miscellaneous tasks we do each day.

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

In 2020, the Wastewater Department saw some changes in staffing. Brice Bond, who had been employed with the Kennebunkport Wastewater Department since 2016, and recently as Chief Operator, left his employment to take a position with the Kennebunk Sewer District. His departure left a vacancy. Pursuant to several proposed capital projects for the Wastewater Department, further restructuring of Public Works was considered and a Principal Process/Project Engineer was hired. Eric Labelle was selected for this position. Eric comes from a very diverse engineering background and has held many public service management positions.

The Town of Kennebunkport had recently contracted with Wright-Pierce to design and complete some replacement upgrades to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The remaining project to be completed under this round of upgrades was the replacement of the Wastewater Plant's standby emergency generator. The existing generator had been in service since 1979. This project was completed December 21st, 2020 and the new generator is now online.

In the upcoming fiscal year, we will be requesting \$5M in capital funding to be expended over the next 3 years. The funding will be used to upgrade and replace the following 40-year-old infrastructure some of which are currently showing signs of failure:

- Secondary clarifier's structural/mechanical systems
- Upgrade the sludge dewatering (necessary to meet regulatory requirements)
- Replace three major pump stations (Cape Porpoise, Paddy Creek and Wildes District)

In 2020, the Wastewater Treatment Plant processed a total of 109,961,000 gallons of wastewater. The wastewater treatment process generated a total of 1,328,000 gallons of biosolids that was turned into 1,200 yards of compost. Just for comparison, here are the numbers for recent past years:

BEACH ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

What a year! 2020 marked the eighth year of the Beach Advisory Committee (BAC). The BAC held seven meetings this year with only the first meeting in January being held in person. The zoom meetings held for the rest of the year were both a challenge and an opportunity for those far far away to attend in real time. As we all struggled to master our new meeting format, the work of the committee continued virtually. Just like the rest of the world...

The first and most pressing issue this year was beach safety. How to remain an open beach while observing the guidelines for safety and protection in the year of the COVID virus infection. Many discussions were held via zoom and email regarding how to make the best recommendations we could. It was an impossible task to restrict the numbers of people using the beach, therefore, the discussion centered on limiting parking and educating the public on social distancing even when on the beach and the use of masks. Parking was opened gradually, reaching full capacity on Memorial Day. Throughout the summer social distancing was strongly encouraged and masks suggested. Beach fire permits were eliminated for 2020.

The consolidation and simplification of the signs at Goose Rocks Beach has become a goal. Hopefully, we will see significant progress on this before next summer.

Dune grass protection efforts continue. Many areas were roped-off in hopes that the grass will be allowed to strengthen and continue to protect the beach and surrounding neighborhoods. Indeed, new growth was observed by the end of the summer!

The endangered plovers and migratory birds had a great year!

An enclosed bulletin board was created and posted at the General Store at the end of Dyke Rd. Yet one more way for the BAC to get the "message" out! Take a look and stay up to date!

Secondary to the COVID crisis, the dog restrictions again became a central focus. A sub-committee was formed and tasked with reviewing the current "dog rules" with an eye toward simplifying and updating. Not an easy task with all communication taking place virtually and through email. Respect for the safety of our endangered plovers and the liability of the town was the foremost concern. The sub-committee worked for two months and presented a resolution for approval to the BAC and then to the Board of Selectmen. This will come up for a vote at the next town meeting.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO ORDINANCE:

4/1 - 9/15: any time that dogs are allowed on the beach, they must be on-leash and must be kept 200 feet away from nesting areas of endangered/threatened birds.

6/15 - Labor Day: dogs must be off the beach by 9:00 am and may return onto the beach at 5:00 pm on-leash.

9/16 - 3/31 Dogs may be on the beach any time of day. Dogs must be on-leash from 12:00 pm - 6:00 pm. Dogs may be off-leash all other times provided they are under voice/sight control.

We will continue to meet via Zoom until the emergency order is lifted in the State of Maine. Please join us! Thank you for your support!

BUDGET BOARD REPORT

This was a different year for the Budget Board, as it was for everyone else. After only two in-person meetings at the beginning of March, the budget process was put on hold while the world adapted to COVID-19 protocols.

After several weeks, the budget process began again, this time via Zoom meetings. Due to executive orders from Governor Mills, annual town meeting was moved back to July to give additional time for municipalities to make preparations to hold elections and town meetings within the guidelines issued by the Governor.

For those citizens unfamiliar with the annual budget process, each Thursday in March, the Budget Board meets jointly with the Board of Selectmen to hear presentations by the Town Manager, the Town's department directors, boards and committees and non-profit organizations. After all are heard, each Board meets separately to review the requests and make recommendations. Should there be any disagreement between the Boards, a final meeting with both Boards is held.

The recommendations of each Board are incorporated into the Town Meeting Warrant to be voted by the Town's registered voters at the Annual Town Meeting. This process is in keeping with the longstanding New England custom and provides the Town voters with the confidence that all recommendations have been thoroughly reviewed.

Should a Special Town Meeting be held involving any request for funds, again both Boards meet to review and recommend the request.

As always, the Budget Board wishes to express appreciation to all town employees, department directors, the Town Manager, and the Board of Selectmen for their commitment and dedication to the residents of the Town of Kennebunkport.

CEMETERY COMMITTEE REPORT

Most of the work done by the Cemetery Committee happens in the spring, summer, and fall. That is when we can get out and about to check on trees that might need cutting, headstones that need replacing, repairing chains on granite posts, repairing, or visiting cemeteries that have not been checked recently. This past year, a fair amount of tree work was done, and the Springer Hill Cemetery (Roberts Lane) needed a fair amount of attention to some of its headstones.

During this time of social distancing, walking through our town cemeteries can be a peaceful, quiet, safe way to get outside, enjoy nature, reflect on history and art and get some exercise. Please contact the Cemetery Committee (via Town Hall) if you see fallen or dead trees in cemeteries you might be walking through.

Because the Cemetery Committee has not been able to meet during the pandemic, Greg Pargellis, who has been on the committee the longest, created an excel spreadsheet, an electronic document of all the Kennebunkport cemeteries. This includes where cemeteries are located, who is buried in each cemetery, veterans, etc. This information was shared with the Town of Kennebunkport and the Kennebunkport Historical Society. The spreadsheet is a work in progress. Most of the information is gleaned from the documents of Clarie Nickerson. Her research was done many years ago (documented in a book on our town cemeteries available at the Historical Society). We are still comparing her information with present day research we have done. Unfortunately, not being able to meet in person has curtailed some of this work.

We are currently looking for information anyone might have concerning a veteran's stone that recently appeared in one of our smaller cemeteries.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

In 2020, the Kennebunkport Conservation Commission continued its ongoing stewardship of protecting our town's natural resources, and serving as a research, advisory, and advocacy group on environmental and conservation issues related to the Town of Kennebunkport.

The Commission has assumed responsibilities in the Town Climate Change Goals, including measure and monitor of greenhouse gas emissions. Kennebunkport does have a monitor station for ozone during the summer months, and we will continue to work with the Sustainability Coordinator for community wide greenhouse gas emissions studies. The Commission started to gather information by contacting the Maine Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Air Quality, to ascertain how greenhouse gases are measured at the community level. The development of educational material for how to reduce greenhouse gas emissions is a continuing agenda item for the Commission.

In support of the Town Climate Change Goals for Land Ecosystems, the Commission started discussion on the use of fertilizers and pesticides on municipal properties. The Commission contacted the Public Works department to learn about the Town's fertilizer and pesticide programs. The Commission is also continuing to monitor and study pesticide and fertilizer ordinances in other towns and cities, and is working on a draft for such ordinance.

Also related to Land Ecosystems, the Commission started discussion on how to mitigate the loss of trees in the housing developments. Trees are a positive factor in carbon sequestration, and the Commission will continue to address this issue.

Along the issues related climate change and the related increase in high tides and storm tides, the Commission discussed the repeated high levels of bacteria at Goose Rocks beach and will continue to monitor and research this situation.

The Commission continues its interest in private residential swimming pool discharge and contacted Water Quality Management at the Maine Department of Environmental Protection who advises that swimming pool water is toxic, and should not be discharged into any body of water or stream. The Commission is pursuing how to regulate this activity.

This year, the Commission efforts with educational outreach programs for organic lawn care were hampered by the coronavirus. There is information on the Conservation Commission website as part of the Lawns for Lobsters program. We also encourage homeowners to visit the informational links posted on the Commission's Facebook page.

GROWTH PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT

In 2020, the Growth Planning Committee (GPC) continued the work on updating the Town's Comprehensive Plan but at a slower pace than originally planned. As part of the Town immediate response to the COVID-19 pandemic many committees and projects were placed on hold including the update of the Plan. The GPC along with our consultants on this project, Thomas Morgan of TMZ Planning and Liz Durfee from EF Deign & Planning, were making excellent progress thru our meeting on March 20, 2020 prior to this stop.

The project resumed with our meeting on October 6, 2020. The stoppage of work put us behind schedule. There were several outreach events planned in the late Spring and Summer of 2020 that had to be postponed until 2021. These outreach events are especially important to gain valuable insight from Town residents and other stakeholders on many aspects important to the Plan. The project schedule has been re-worked to hold these events in the late Spring and Summer of 2021. Additionally, we have added on-line surveys for 2021 to provide another method to garner your comments and ideas on different topics important to our Town.

In July of 2020 Barbara Barwise stepped down from the GPC. I would like to thank Barbara for her many years of service to the GPC as both an active member and Secretary for the committee. KENNEBUNKPORT HERITAGE HOUSING TRUST (KHHT) REPORT

The KHHT ended 2019 on a high point having completed two successful fundraising events that collected over \$42,000 to be used to pay for the costs of site development, engineering expenses and legal fees. Stephen Doe of Sebago Technics was hired to organize and submit the development plan for Heritage Woods to the Planning Board. This is the name given to the land on Route 9 (Main Street) formerly used by Kennebunkport for the town ice skating rink. Agreements were signed with Hallmark Homes, a modular home builder, to assemble six homes manufactured by KBS on the land in Heritage Woods. Both companies are Maine-based enterprises. Our application for approval by the Planning Board was submitted on March 23, 2020.

By the first week in April, the pandemic caused by the COVID-19 virus was spreading across the country and the State of Maine. The need to follow the quarantine guidelines essentially shut down face-to-face interaction with the Planning Board and all town committees. Our planning board review process increased from 4-5 months to 7-8 months. The pandemic also halted planned fundraising activities and regular KHHT board meetings. Work on the project continued by using email contacts between board members and Sebago Technics. In late May, we were able to reinstate presentations to the Planning Board. The Planning Board granted final approval for the Heritage Woods development on Nov. 3, 2020. Use of the Zoom format continued for the rest of 2020 and will continue for most of 2021.

From June thru the end of 2020, the KHHT web site was enhanced to provide extensive information and guidance to interested parties about how to apply for one of the homes being built. This process required many discussions and legal reviews to prepare the final documents for release to the public. KHHT approved a cost of \$220,000 for the one-story, three bedroom, two-bath home of approx. 1,200 sq. ft.; and, \$297,500 for the two-story, three bedroom, two-bath home of approx. 1,700 sq. ft. Delivery of the homes is scheduled to start in mid-April 2021 and proceed incrementally thru late September. Occupancy is expected two months after delivery.

KHHT has a memorandum of understanding with Bangor Savings Bank (BSB) as an approved MaineHousing lender under the First Home Loan Program. BSB will be offering mortgages to qualified applicants for the homes in Heritage Woods. As part of the marketing and outreach program for applicants, KHHT set up info sessions in mid-December for potential applicants to answer questions and to assist with contacting BSB as they prepare to apply for a home.

In 2021, KHHT is expecting to complete marketing, construction, and occupancy of the six-unit subdivision and to begin consideration of its next venture.

The Kennebunk River Committee continues to monitor activities relative to safety and the condition of the Kennebunk River in efforts to retain its viability and importance to the towns of Kennebunk and Kennebunkport.

Due to COVID-19, the River Committee held meetings in February and August only. The meetings followed strict COVID-19 Guidelines set by Kennebunk Town Hall. All guidelines were strictly enforced by Chairman Rick Roberts.

The US Army Corp of Engineers plan to repair the underpinning on the leeward side of the Colony beach jetty in Kennebunkport and repairs to the Gooch's Beach jetty in Kennebunk. The repairs are scheduled to begin in Spring/Summer 2021.

A reminder that the Kennebunk Town Transfer Station now accepts expired boat flares for proper disposal.

The River Committee unanimously approved the proposed Pump-Out Station at Kennebunkport Marina. The Pump-Out Station has been installed and is a welcomed need for transient and local boaters.

The River Committee unanimously approved the proposed bulkhead repairs at 47 Ocean Avenue Kennebunkport.

The River Committee would like to recognize the continued support and cooperation from both Kennebunk and Kennebunkport.

LIGHTING COMMITTEE REPORT

We see our mission as preserving the night sky for residents, visitors, and future generations in Kennebunkport.

At the end of the 2020, we welcomed new member, Todd Merolla.

2020 was the year that the Town finally purchased all of the streetlights in town from CMP. This had been talked about on the committee since around 1990. The oldest streetlights, that the Town was paying a monthly lease on, some were installed as far back as 1947.

A CMP approved private contractor was hired, by the Town, to provide maintenance. After the purchase, the Town replaced in the radial wave, or platter lights, all of the 105- watt incandescent lamps with 16- watt LED lamps. The Public Works Department is working with CMP to have our electrical rates reduced based on the 89 watts per fixture savings. Multiply the 89 watts/fixture times the approximately 200 fixtures in Town and we have an initial savings of 17,800 watts or 17.8 kw. Our contractor is trying to resolve long term issues with broken fixtures. In some cases, we will start to install new LED lights in places where the existing Platter Lights are broken. Due to the age and style of the existing platter lights replacement parts are not available.

The other exciting event for the Lighting Committee and the Town is the digital mapping of all of these streetlights. This will give the Town and the committee easier access to determine the future of streetlights in town including discovering lights on private property or lights that are serving private landowners rather than on more traveled areas in Town.

Our stand-alone ordinance has been incorporated into the new Town Code, chapter 245. However, the Lighting Committee recognizes that the code as written is in need of update due to LED technology.

Please read our ordinance available on the Town website and evaluate your own exterior lighting for compliance. Also, check out the “Public Works Department” for the two tabs: the menu item tab referencing the Town street lights:

- Street Light Repair (A form to fill out if a lamp is “burned out.”) This form will be up-dated now that the Town owns all of the streetlights.
- Street Lights in Kennebunkport” Dated 11-12-2014. This on-line list is out of date and will be up-dated soon.

Anyone interested in our night environment in town is encouraged to join the Lighting Committee.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT

The Novel Coronavirus changed the Planning Board this year. Our first four meetings were at the Fire Station as usual, but from March 18th to the end of May, there were no meetings. Since then, we have had our twice monthly meetings via Zoom.

Two big items came through the board this year. The Kennebunkport Heritage Housing Trust presented their Heritage Woods subdivision with six affordable housing units on the old town skating rink property. The approval process included preliminary and final subdivision plans and spread over six of the Zoom meetings through early November.

The other big item is ongoing. The Colony Hotel, which presented a sketch plan in late 2019, came in with its plans for replacing the Fontenay Terrace motel and other buildings on the north side of Colony Ave with new hotel rooms and a marketplace area. The existing support buildings on the south side of Colony will be reconfigured to make the parking lot more circular, and to include some new “green-roofed” dormitories. This project is currently still in review and is expected to come back to the board in Spring 2021.

As always, changes to buildings in Resource Protection Zones are a major focus, since these are generally non-conforming uses of the property (setbacks, etc.) which predate the Land Use Ordinance. The goal is to make the building conforming or at least make them less non-conforming.

We also had changes of the conditional use of commercial properties, in this case addition of outdoor seating at Hurricane Restaurant and year-round service at Earth Restaurant.

SHADE TREE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Shade Tree Committee has accomplished many goals during this pandemic year. Here are some of the highlights of our work:

- We have planned a 2021 spring planting campaign in May. We will plant a half-dozen elms along streets in Kennebunkport village as well as other trees in strategic locations. If you are interested in an elm or another shade tree, contact Tree Warden, John Ripton at jripton@kennebunkportme.gov for details.
- We have joined the American Chestnut Restoration project to restore blight-resistant native American chestnuts to Maine forests and the streets of Kennebunkport. Literally billions of these trees were killed by a devastating blight in the early 20th century. The American chestnuts are native to this part of the world while the horse chestnut is an import from Eurasia. If you are interest in free saplings to plant on your property, contact our project liaison Steve Powell at stevepowell728@gmail.com.
- We completed the third year of our ongoing 3-year-cycle of elm injections to prevent Dutch Elm Disease. In spring 2021, we will begin the cycle once again. We have approximately 100 elms along our streets.
- We injected several large ash trees to prevent the spread of the Emerald Ash Borer that is a threat to ashes throughout southern Maine and beyond. We selected another several ash trees along Oak Street for injection in spring 2021.
- We continued our oversight of shade trees along the town streets, advising residents of actual and potential problems. This included the removal of a few trees and pruning multiple trees including some cabling and bolting of trees for improved stability and extending the life of our valuable shade trees and overall town canopy.
- We applied for Tree City USA designation, a distinction we have received for 43 years, making Kennebunkport the oldest Tree City in Maine.

- We continued planning for a shade tree walking tour in Kennebunkport Village with QR codes on a dozen trees. This will raise awareness of our shade trees and provide valuable species and ecological information. It will also add a dimension to the town's tourist experience.
- We produced and the town mailed our inaugural newsletter with useful information on trees including their health and maintenance, potential pathogens and ecological and aesthetic benefits of Kennebunkport's trees.
- We completed another successful Elm Watch summer observation of elms across Kennebunkport. If you would like to join the Elm Watch team as a volunteer, please contact jripton@kennebunkportme.gov for details. The Elm Watch volunteers visit our elms twice a week (about a one- to two-hour commitment each week from June to the end of August. Volunteers look for evidence of Dutch Elm Disease and other conditions, report any findings and help the town preserve its majestic elm population. Orientation, instruction and assignments are provided at a June meeting. Our volunteers become familiar enough with “their elms” to spot potential infections, an invaluable service.
- We made presentations to community groups on the ecology of trees and the work to preserve the town's extensive canopy.

THE SOLID WASTE/RECYCLING COMMITTEE REPORT



The Solid Waste Committee was organized at the direction of the Board of Selectmen in June of 2019 (in 2020 it was renamed the Solid Waste/Recycling Committee – the Committee) to investigate the feasibility, and associated costs, of re-establishing a publicly funded recycling program in Kennebunkport.

In February of 2020, the Committee made a presentation to the BOS outlining their findings and proposing that curbside recycling be reinstated in July of 2020. This proposal was accepted in principle depending upon available funds. At the end of the Spring 2020 budget process, it was agreed that due to the financial pressure of COVID-19, the restart of recycling would be delayed until January 2021.

In September of 2020, contracts were signed for biweekly collection of curbside recycling with Casella, and for recycling processing with ecomaine – both to begin in January of 2021.

ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS REPORT

The Zoning Board of Appeals began the year as we all did, going about our business, the normal course of events for a municipal board. In February, we granted a Conditional Use Application for a Home Occupation, and in early March we upheld a 1989 Decision while finding a proper procedural path to accommodate the applicant's request to terminate a condominium form of ownership.

Then, on March 11, 2020, the world changed. Confusion, isolation, and fear in the form of a pandemic descended upon us. It was the beginning of a great darkness. And then, largely on our own, we all began to slowly find our way, a new way, though littered with innumerable obstacles and hurdles to overcome.

Like all Town Boards, we found ourselves doing business on ZOOM, thanks in large part to the guidance and efforts of the Town's dedicated and indispensable technicians, and a sliver of normalcy reminded us that maybe we'd all get through this.

In June, the Board denied an Appeal for want of jurisdiction. In October, we granted a Conditional Use Application for Residential Rental Accommodations. And in November, we denied a Variance Request for failing to meet the very rigid standards established by the Maine Law Court.

We made it through 2020, most of us, a year that will never be forgotten, and lurched into 2021 as the clouds again darkened, but with hope alive.

There was 1 disinterment and 23 burials, of which 7 were full burials and 16 were cremations.

We wish to express our thanks and gratitude to those individuals who support the cemetery through their donations. These donations help us immensely in maintaining the cemetery as the attractive peaceful place we all appreciate.

THE KENNEBUNK, KENNEBUNKPORT AND WELLS WATER DISTRICT

The Kennebunk, Kennebunkport and Wells Water District is a non-profit, quasi municipal public water utility that was established in 1921 by an act of the Maine State Legislature. The Water District serves an area that encompasses the Towns of Kennebunk, Kennebunkport, Wells, Ogunquit, Arundel and small portions of Biddeford and York. The area includes a population which varies seasonally from about 30,000 to over 100,000. It is directed by a four-member Board of Trustees, one elected from each of the towns of Kennebunk, Kennebunkport, Wells and Ogunquit.

2020 was a year of constant adjustment for the District. It started as a typical year until the COVID-19 pandemic. We spent about a month understanding the expectations of state government and what the executive orders meant for our business. We then swiftly assembled our Health and Safety Committee and with assistance from our human resource consultant, developed an exposure and return to work plan that has guided us well and also became a model for many other utilities. We have developed modifications to our business practices including remote work for some, added separation and coordination for others, and of course PPE and cleaning that has become the new “normal”. We would like to thank all of our customers and communities for your patience and understanding as our service has likely changed from customary ways.

Last year was another strong year for the Water District, despite the pandemic. Although not record-breaking as with 2016, it compared reasonably well on several fronts. The 1.1182 billion gallons produced in 2020 (2nd highest all time) represented a 5.6% increase in water production compared with 2019. This was largely due to the prolonged drought during the summer. Usually the major changes in consumption follow all customer classes but 2020 was significantly different in that regard. Residential demand was 15% higher than budgeted, yet Commercial demand was 10% lower; very likely due to the pandemic. From a financial perspective, we received \$8.27 million in total operating revenues, as compared to \$7.47 million in 2019. All of this contributed to a projected (unaudited) net income for 2020 of approximately \$527,000, as compared to a net income of \$26,000 in 2019. Overall, the primary drivers for water production and revenues are related to weather conditions during the warmer months and long-term customer growth. In recent years, there has been increased volatility in both water demand and therefore revenues.

Precipitation (liquid equivalent) during 2020, as measured at our Branch Brook Filtration Plant, was significantly below average at 44.50” (the 17-year running average is 54.45”) as our entire service territory experienced a classification D3 Extreme Drought during the summer months. Despite the drought conditions, the District was able to meet customer demands, which were the second highest of all time at 1,118.2 million gallons (MG). This was accomplished using the District’s entire portfolio of water supply sources which includes surface water (709.7MG –

63.5%), groundwater (393.0MG – 35.1%) and utility interconnections (15.5MG – 1.4%). From a customer growth perspective, it appears the local economy is still healthy, with 133 customers added in 2020. This compares with 197 in 2019 and 119 in 2018, resulting in a continued customer growth rate of about 1%. Our customer base now stands at 14,257 metered accounts, ranking us the third largest water utility in Maine.

The District's commitment to safety continues to be recognized by our Worker's Compensation insurance carrier (MEMIC). For 2020 we once again achieved the lowest "experience modification factor" (Mod Factor) that MEMIC has seen for a water utility. The Mod Factor, which measures the actual worker's compensation claim history of an employer, directly affects the insurance premium paid by that employer. For us, the Mod Factor of 0.59 (same as 2019 and down from 0.60 in 2018 and 0.61 in 2017) will result in our worker's compensation insurance premium being reduced to 59% of the "standard industry average" amount.

As reported in previous annual reports, the District discovered trace amounts of perfluorinated compounds (PFAS) in its Kennebunk River Well supply and even though the levels were below EPA health advisory levels, we stopped using water from that location to get a better understanding of this newly identified contaminant. We initially performed pilot studies to evaluate treatment technologies for removing PFAS. In June of 2018 we introduced and went online with a full-scale pilot study which achieved great results removing PFAS using pressurized granular activated carbon (GAC) filtration. Finally, in May of 2020, the new permanent GAC filtration facility went online and has been performing very well, treating 168.4MG of water by year end with no detection of PFAS compounds. The success of this project was recognized by the Maine Drinking Water Program who in turn nominated it for the prestigious EPA 2020 Aquarius Award. Every year, one project is nominated for this award from each state (50 total nominations) with one "Exceptional Project" selected for each of five categories. The District's GAC Treatment Facility project qualified for two of the five categories, Excellence in Environmental and Public Health Protection and Excellence in Problem Solving. The winners were recently announced and while the KKW GAC filtration project was not ultimately selected as a winner, it did receive honorable mention by the selection committee. As nice as it is to be recognized at the national level, we are most proud of the perseverance and team effort required to achieve such a successful outcome. For further information, you can refer to numerous articles in recent issues of our customer newsletter What's on Tap that can be found on our website at www.kkw.org.

The pandemic slowed our meter replacement project as protection of employees and customers was a priority. However, toward the end of 2020 we worked with many local plumbers and added safety protocols that enabled us to resume the Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) program in earnest. In 2020, the District completed 1,694 meter replacements and we project to have full AMI meters visit www.kkw.org.

The District continues an aggressive water main replacement program based on evaluations of pipe material, condition, age, break history, hydraulic capacity, water quality and potential system growth. In addition, we make every effort to coordinate with other State and local roadway projects to minimize disruption and pavement costs. We are pleased to report that for the past 27 years, the District has averaged replacing 0.86% of its distribution system per year. This is close to the desired water industry “gold standard” of 1% per year, based upon an expected 100-year usable life for water mains. Very few other water utilities have maintained such an aggressive (yet appropriate) water main replacement schedule. We have accomplished this task while keeping water rates below that of the average Maine water utility.

The following is a partial list of distribution projects funded by the District and installed by our personnel during 2020.

- Ocean Avenue, Kennebunkport: Replaced ~1,200 feet of obsolete 8-inch cast iron pipe with 12-inch PVC pipe in conjunction with the Town’s new seawall/drainage/sidewalk construction and roadway reclamation project.
- Fletcher Street, Kennebunk: Replaced ~2,500 feet of obsolete 10-inch AC pipe with 16-inch PVC in conjunction with the Town’s upcoming roadway reclamation project.
- Laudholm Farm Road/Old Farm Lane, Wells: Installed ~3,750 feet of 16-inch PVC pipe as Phase I of a two phase project that will ultimately allow the District to abandon ~4,200 feet of obsolete cross-country 10-inch AC pipe (circa 1937) that runs through Rachel Carson controlled property.

In addition to the above projects, individuals and developers funded several water main extensions totaling 548 feet in length, as compared to 4,497 feet installed in 2019.

Drinking water quality remains a top priority. We continue to improve operational strategies with our unique blending of groundwater and surface water to assure consistently high water quality. We have also been working closely with our neighboring water utilities to the north and south to assure reliable interconnections and high water quality compatibility for when we need to share resources. All State and Federal water quality standards were met during 2020, and full water quality details can be found in the District’s annual Water Quality Report from the Summer 2020 issue of What’s on Tap. By maintaining a dedicated, well-trained staff and continually upgrading our process equipment and control systems, we assure the highest degree of reliability in the quality of drinking water for our customers.

KENNEBUNKPORT CONSERVATION TRUST REPORT

Prior to last year, 2020 was a number thought by most of us to relate to excellent vision. That was a good thing, something to aspire to. Now, that same number might very well provoke memories of great trials and unwanted changes, a time best forgotten. Like most things in life, those thoughts aren't mutually exclusive, for the results of the worldwide pandemic have helped us focus with perfect clarity on the things that really matter. Even as our minds have been engrossed with concerns for the safety of family and friends, the health of loved ones, and the changes to our daily routines, we have come to see that it's the small things, that we often take for granted, that are most important. The people and places we love, the community we call home, the natural beauty that surrounds us, that is the real bedrock of our lives. Those are the things that give us strength and bring us peace.

Even in the most difficult of years, the Trust never worked harder to continue on with its mission, working from home or in shifts to accomplish its goals. Early in the year we were delighted to receive three new pieces of land in the Town Forest area, encompassing 68 acres, the generous gift of Marjorie Campbell. For that we are grateful. Closer to downtown, David Jourdan and Bud Danis worked to complete the beautiful one-mile trail in James Wood. This lovely piece of land had been donated by David and Lisanne James and is a wonderful part of the Trust and a remarkable gift to the community. Throughout the year, our Trail Stewards (Bud Danis, David Jourdan, Wayne & Susan Bell, Kate Adams & others) worked to keep open our 25 miles of trails for public use, and they were used like never before. At the same time, our Island Stewards (led by Jon Dykstra and Carol Morris) kept our island campsites safely open and saw them used by a record number. In both cases, the respect and care that was shown for those properties was an inspiration. Scott and Karen Dombrowski continued to look after Goat Island Lighthouse and kept it in good repair. During the year we performed our first timber harvest on a 25-acre parcel in the Smith Preserve which will serve to enhance the health of the forest and create a diverse wildlife habitat. Land management plans were created by Dr. Pam Morgan whose UNE students did studies and presentations about them. Invasive species were identified, and work continued to remove them. Gail Roller, Lynn Jourdan and Kate Adams did an amazing job at keeping the Trust's gardens beautiful. Through the work of Elizabeth Spahr, KCT also watched over Ganny's Garden and the Anchor to Windward, Kennebunkport's tributes to President and Mrs. Bush.

A labyrinth was completed at the Emmons Preserve on a beautiful site by the Batson's River. Recognizing all of the planning and hard work that it took to create it, the Trust awarded its Volunteer of the Year award, an especially created labyrinth shirt, to all of those who were involved in its creation: Juliet Altham, Rebecca Roberts, Louise Spang, Elizabeth Kelley, Jenne James, Bethe Hagens, Kate Brown, Ottie Ann Fried, Melanie Montembeau, Fran Liautaud, Jennifer Comeau, Cheryl Phillips and Ingunn Milla Joergensen. Noting her exceptional leadership of the project, Juliet Altham was also presented with the coveted Bobblehead Award.

Throughout 2019, a committee led by Russ Grady had worked with the award-winning landscape design team from Richardson & Associates to create plans for a new Trust holding called Meadow Woods Preserve. Plans were created that would include a restored pond with a pollinator meadow, a solar powered welcome hut, a network of all-inclusive trails, naturally landscaped off-leash dog enclosures and more. That work BEGAN in 2020 with the creation of the pond and surrounding landscaping. We are convinced that MWP will become one of the most loved Trust properties in the years to come. Work is already scheduled for 2021. The preserve will stretch from Route 9 to the Oak Ridge Road.

Leia Lowery and Bailey Ferris quickly pivoted when faced with the challenge of a distanced learning school year. They hosted 9 weeks of virtual activities for kids through the Trust's "Quarantine Corner" and created over 30 activities for kids to do from home. They created over 175 summer kits to help children explore and learn more about the Kennebunk's land, history and wildlife. They continued making virtual field trips for the winter and spring semesters so that students (500 of them) could complement their Next Gen Science Standards through our hands-on, nature-based, multidisciplinary approach.

Out of the Gulf of Maine class grew a new organization, the Kennebunkport Climate Initiative. The goals of this new organization will be to create a nationwide, grassroots, youth-oriented program to educate citizens about the climate crisis and lead them to action. This will be a non-partisan, scientifically based educational organization. Amazing progress was made in 2020. KCI developed a Board of Directors and Board of Advisors with astounding backgrounds from around the world. It established a set of By-laws and received its own 501-C-3 non-profit designation from the IRS. Staff is working from Kennebunkport, Colorado and California and they are spreading out from there. Jono Anzalone was hired as the first KCI Executive Director and will be living in Kennebunkport. He joined KCI after serving the International Red Cross, where he was the Head of Disaster and Crisis, Preparedness, Response, and Recovery for the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies for the Americas and Caribbean region. I would encourage all to go to kportclimate.org. and check out who is involved and all that is happening. Kennebunkport will be facing many climate related challenges in the near future.

The Arundel Conservation Trust, a sister organization of KCT, enjoyed another amazing year, creating trails on its land behind the new Arundel Town Hall and in Welch Woods. The also created a new bicycle "Flow Trail" which is receiving rave reviews from all.

The Cape Porpoise Archaeological Alliance, a collaboration between KCT and the Brick Store Museum had another very successful year. Led by lead archaeologist Tim Spahr, the team completed restoration work on the 700-year-old canoe they found in Cape Porpoise harbor, the oldest ever found in the Northeast. Their work was published in several professional journals and will be featured in a display at the Brick Store Museum. Their work on the islands continues.

The Trust's relationship with the Kennebunkport Heritage Housing Trust continued and grew stronger, as did the relationship between the Trust and the town as we all work and plan to provide the best community possible to the current and future residents of Kennebunkport. The drive through Halloween event at the Emmons Preserve brought trick or treating joy to hundreds thanks to such cooperation.

In the office, Heather Magaw oversaw our constant administrative needs and did a great job. She was assisted by David Jourdan and volunteer extraordinaire, Carol Krauter who gave wonderful oversight to our income and disbursements. That membership income hit a new record this year, over \$325,000 from 840 households. For that we are extremely grateful! A new "Thought of the Week" and "Looking Back" posting was sent each week to KCT's 4110 Facebook and 1400 email followers. Officers elected for the year were: Russ Grady, President, Pam Morgan, Vice President, Bud Danis, Treasurer and Jerry Mullen, Secretary. You can find out more about KCT at: www.kporttrust.org.

We all were greatly saddened at the loss of four people who gave their devoted service to the Trust for many years. They were Tony Viehmann, Mark Roller, Wayne Adams, and Craig Giefer, and we will certainly miss their energy, enthusiasm, and comradery.

KENNEBUNKPORT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, INC.
REPORT (KEMS)



2020 Horton Ambulance

Kennebunkport Emergency Medical Services is a private, not-for-profit organization that provides emergency medical care and transport to the citizens and visitors of Kennebunkport. In addition to providing medical care for our community, we also participate in mutual aid agreements with the towns of Arundel, Biddeford, Kennebunk, and Wells. KEMS operates out of the Cape Porpoise Fire Station, where space is leased from the Atlantic Volunteer Engine Company for ambulance housing, office space and employee living quarters.

KEMS began in 1979 with a small group of volunteers and an old Cadillac ambulance donated to the Town by the Bibber family. Over the years, KEMS has seen an exceptional amount of growth from a volunteer organization, to a payroll driven per diem service. This change to our operational model allows us to provide EMS coverage to Kennebunkport and our surrounding communities, 24 hours per day, 365 day per year with two paid staff at all times. We employ a highly trained, professional group of 13 Per-Diem Paramedic's, supplemented by a skilled group of 24 Drivers and EMT's of various levels. Our employee's professionalism and diverse levels of training and years of experience allow KEMS to provide the highest level of patient care possible through the skilled hands of our core group of dedicated EMS Professionals.

KEMS utilizes a tiered deployment model that allows us to provide both Basic (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) levels of care. These care levels include but are not limited to immediate BLS access first response, life-saving CPR and AED Defibrillation. This skill set combined with advanced life-saving medical care, high quality ALS patient medical assessments, cardiac monitoring with EKG interpretation, defibrillation, IV/IO access, medication administration, along with many other advanced procedures make KEMS a dynamic and effective pre-hospital resource to Kennebunkport and our surrounding communities for both 911 response and community events.

In 2020, KEMS responded to 309 calls for service both in Kennebunkport and providing mutual aid to surrounding communities. In addition to emergency medical calls, we also provide support to the Kennebunkport Fire Department, Police Department and Public Health Department upon request.

Our amazing cadre of EMS providers covered a total of 730 Paramedic shifts and 730 Driver / EMT shifts throughout 2020. Shift coverage is broken down into 12 hour blocks covering both day and night time periods. This totals 17,472 hours of EMS coverage at the combined EMT and Paramedic levels. While these coverage numbers are impressive, these figures do not include all the other various training hours, courses or functions attended by our employees throughout the year.

KEMS operating expenses come from a model that blends capital received from the appropriation from the Town of Kennebunkport, our billing revenue for service, the generous donations from the people of Kennebunkport from our Fund Drive, our Subscription Program and use the KEMS Endowment Fund. As volunteerism has declined universally across the United States, KEMS has had to evolve to remain current to meet the challenges associated with these changing trends and community needs. The largest cost associated with this evolution has been our change to a paid per-diem organization. While our service remains not-for-profit, this change was absolutely essential to fulfill our patient care obligation to the town.

In July 2020, KEMS took delivery of a state-of-the-art 2020 Horton Ambulance from Greenwood Emergency Vehicles. The new ambulance has an updated patient compartment fully stocked with high quality life- saving equipment, improved vehicle safety features and a power load patient loading system. This approximately \$250,000 dollar purchase was possible through use of the KEMS Endowment Fund. The KEMS Board dedicated the new ambulance to the memory of Judith Barret, a long time Town Nurse and KEMS Board member.

As the dedicated EMS provider for the Town of Kennebunkport, we would also like to recognize the hard work and dedication of the voluntary Kennebunkport EMS Board of Directors, Kennebunkport Fire Department, Kennebunkport Police Department, Kennebunkport Public Health Department and Emergency Dispatch Staff. They truly are professionals and make each call for service a coordinated and successful event as we all strive to provide the highest level of service possible to those we are sworn to serve.

At this time, I would like to take this opportunity to introduce you to our amazing staff.

The year 2020 is done and dusted and what a year it was! There is an expression about when one door closes another door opens. Well, in the case of the Cape Porpoise Library, we closed, we opened with reduced hours and enhanced sanitation and we closed again as Covid 19 cases increased. We are hopeful that the next time we open, we will stay open with full hours of operation and all services for all patrons, including our children who I have missed immensely. During our closure, we continued to stock our Little Free Library, opened by appointment, and increased our book deliveries. During 2020 our hours of operation were approximately 40 % of those in 2019. The decrease in hours of operation coincided with a similar decrease in the number of patrons served and media items checked out. At first, I found this discouraging, but in actuality the number of patrons served, and media items checked out, when considered as a function of hours of operation, indicate very little difference between 2019 and 2020. I feel proud that we survived 2020 and that we did our level best to serve our patrons in new and creative ways. All in all, we had approximately 1500 patron visits and checked out approximately 2000 media items in 2020. As always, we want our patrons to have access to books and our team of volunteers will deliver books to home-bound patrons or anyone not comfortable with coming inside. Just give us a call or contact us through our Facebook page, Cape Porpoise Library at Atlantic Hall.

Thanks to the Atlantic Hall and Library Boards, the library ceiling was painted and looks clean and fresh. In addition, Dick Smith retrofitted, repainted, and installed new window boxes that were found at the Habitat for Humanity Restore. It is a wonderful thing when we can support a local charity, recycle a discarded item, and reuse it to enhance the beauty of our iconic building. While I may have planted the window boxes this year, they were kept happy and healthy by many who watered and tended the flowers throughout the Spring, Summer and Fall. Our windows were decorated throughout the year, but Lynda Bryan went above and beyond with her painted window garden in the Spring, and wonderful banners in the Fall. Inside our entryway, we continue to feature the work of local artists. This year, Heather Dutton, Kelly Jo Shows, Cookie Davis, Ursula Ehlers, and Wade Zahares were featured. We will continue to display artwork as our way to support our talented local artists. If you would like to display your work at the library, just ask. We would be honored to share with our patrons.

Somehow this year we managed to have our Annual Mid-Summer Book Sale and even a small Prelude Fair despite a monsoon-like storm that decided to grace us on that day. We also continued to participate in online sales and consignment. Through these efforts we raised funds for our beloved library. This would not have been possible without our unfailing volunteers, generous shoppers, a few amazing benefactors, and happy circumstances that combined to make it happen.

The Cape Porpoise Library is officially a community library and we work hard to be an integral part of Cape Porpoise and beyond. In 2020, we collected 11 grocery bags of nonperishables for the Community Outreach Services' food pantry and donated 6 bags of candy to the Trail of Treats at Halloween. Many cloth face masks, mittens, scarves and hats were donated to those in need. We collected monetary donations for the Kennebunkport Health Council's Baby Box Program and provided newborn hats and bibs as well. We assisted a middle school patron as a collection site for shoes that were then sent to El Salvador for those in need. As always, working with our local young people brings me great joy and hope for the future.

The Library wants to thank our friends who generously provide us with monetary donations and memorial gifts and the Town of Kennebunkport for inclusion of the Cape Porpoise Library in the annual town budget. Many thanks also to our volunteers, the Library and Atlantic Hall Board of Directors and our patrons who all help and serve to keep us going, even during a pandemic. We look forward to a more normal 2021 but if 2020 showed us anything, it is that we are willing and able to deal with whatever the future has planned. SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR KENNEBUNKPORT STUDENTS

The Olympian Club of Kennebunkport Scholarship Fund was established in 1996 with gifts from friends and members of the Olympian Club of Kennebunkport. The fund is to benefit the University of Maine at Orono; however, campuses within the University of Maine system are eligible as well. Dedicated to “all the ladies who were every members of the club” its purpose is to provide scholarship assistance for undergraduate students studying nursing. The minimum award is at least one-third of the tuition amount, including mandatory fees.


